in the future of the KCCA. Congratulations, Kristina!

With annual elections to the Board scheduled for later this month, there is still time to submit your application if you wish to be placed on the ballot. We have three Board positions to be filled, for which four people have applied. By-laws require that we have, at minimum, a number of volunteer applicants equal to the number of open positions. (Thank you, Terry Pittsley, and the Nominating Committee.)

The Election Committee, cochaired by Terry Pittsley and Katherine Griffith, currently has two other association members. We could use several more member volunteers, especially for the counting portion after the vote. (At least three Association members and at least one Board member are reguired to hold the election.) Keep in mind that if you are going to be out of town, or for some good reason cannot be here to vote, you will be able to pick up an absentee ballot between the twentieth day and the tenth day before the election. Absentee ballots may be turned in any time up to and including the day of the election.

Regarding the elections, unfortunately, I have received several reports of people going around our community and maligning (even slandering) others who are running for office. Not only does that expose those individuals to legal action, it is just plain mean-spirited. We do know who some of these people are and we are asking them to stop. This type of activity has no place in a respectful, supportive adult community. Please keep in

### **Absentee Voting Qualifications** and Procedures

### As Stated in KCCA Resolution Administration 2016-101

Absentee ballots shall be available at the Association Office not less than 10, nor more than 20, days prior to the election. State laws provide an Absentee Ballot may be canceled and returned and the voter may cast a ballot in person, subject to proper documentation in Election Records.

### **ABSENTEE QUALIFICATIONS:**

Absentee ballots may be cast only by Resident-Members or Owner-Members unable to vote in person on Election Day [they can be returned right up to and including the election date] for the these reasons:

- 1. Out of Town. The Member must personally come to the Association Office and request an absentee ballot. A form must be signed attesting that the Member will be out of town on Election Day.
- 2. Physically Disabled. A Member who is disabled must call the Association Office and request an absentee ballot. The Association Administrative Assistant will mail the ballot, along with a form attesting that the Member is physically unable to come to the Clubhouse for the election.
- 3. Conflict of Working Hours. A Member who is unable to vote in person on Election Day because of a conflict in work and voting hours may obtain an absentee ballot from the Association Office and must sign a form attesting to the work conflict.

Absentee ballots are to be printed on colored paper.

### **INSTRUCTIONS TO VOTER:**

- Complete ballot and seal inside Secrecy Envelope.
- · Place the sealed Secrecy Envelope inside the envelope labeled

"Absentee Ballot" and seal.

- · Voter must sign and date on back of outer envelope where indicated.
- · Ballot must be received by Elections representative by established closing hour of elections on Election Day; no exceptions.



**Thursday, June 23, 2016** the King City Travel Club will tour the Japanese Garden & Rose Garden. It's the first week of Summer and a perfect time to visit the world famous gardens.

The traditional Japanese garden is on 5.5 acres, located within Washington Park in the West Hills of Portland. The area is composed of five distinct garden styles. When we enter a Japanese garden, the desired effect is to realize a sense of peace, harmony, and tranquility and to experience the feeling of being a part of nature. In a deep sense, the Japanese garden is a living reflection of the long history and traditional culture of Japan.

Influenced by Shinto, Buddhist, and Taoist philosophies, there is always "something more" in these compositions of stone, water, and plants than meets the

eye. Three of the essential elements used to create a Japanese garden are stone, the "bones" of the landscape; water, the life-giving force; and plants, the tapestry of the four seasons. Japanese garden designers feel that good stone composition is one of the most important elements in creating a well-designed garden. Secondary elements include pagodas, stone lanterns, water basins, arbors, and bridges. Japanese gardens are asymmetrical in design and reflect nature in idealized form.

Portland's International Rose Test Garden, unofficially known as the Portland Rose Garden, is the oldest official continuously operated public rose test garden in the United States and features more than 10,000 roses. Each year hundreds of thousands of visitors from around the world enjoy the sights and scents of the garden, including its spectacular views of downtown and Mount Hood.

Conceived by Jesse A. Currey in 1915 and approved by Portland Parks in 1917, it started as a safe haven for hybrid roses grown in Europe during World War I. Roses started arriving in Portland in 1918, and the garden and amphitheater were dedi-






