Out of bounds (OB) - If the ball is on the golf course side of the white stake the ball is in bounds. If the ball is even with the stake, it is considered OB.

Off tee hit - If you land off tee in an impossible lay, hit a second ball off the tee. If you're not sure if your ball is OB, hit a provisional. Then if you find your first ball is not OB you may play that one. Be sure to declare you are hitting a provisional ball.
