committee chairs for the next year. They are: Paul Downing, Vice President, House Chair; Mike Whitmarsh, Treasurer, Finance Chair; Terry Pittsley, Secretary, Pool Chair; Blair Wyatt, Landscape, Architectural Review & Compliance (LARC) Chair; Joe Wilson, Greens & Census Chair; Katherine Griffith, Technology Chair; and yours truly, President, Pool Construction & Hello Neighbors Chair. By the time this letter is published, chairs will have been appointed for a number of *ad hoc* committees. Board members also serve on other committees. We foresee a busy year ahead!

Our newly promoted Administrator, Kristina Rodriguez, is scheduled to take a legal course for Certification as a Homeowner Association (HOA) expert in the near future, and she continues in her training. With Kristina

in the Administration position, we have high hopes for the future of the KCCA. (I still don't know how she remembers the name of every person she meets!)

During the first week in June, we had to turn off the natural gas supply to the Arts and Crafts Building, Pro Shop and Pool, which has meant no heat or hot water until repairs are made. NW Natural Gas, who was called in to check a gas odor near the Clubhouse, discovered at least two leaks in the very old gas pipes. When it was discovered that 100% gas was coming out of the ground in one spot, we immediately shut off all the gas, then had to make some important decisions, fast. Further deduction led us to believe the old pipes were badly degraded, which meant more leaks were coming if we didn't replace the lines with new black pipe. We obtained two bids for the job. The gas company bid to bring a new line from Royalty Parkway to a new meter location, at a cost just under \$13,000. The second bid was to install new pipe from the existing gas meters, burrowing about half again as far, but for around \$8,500 dollars. Both bids required additional charges to split the gas line to t two different buildings. The second bid and work began in June.

The new gas line costs will be pa Association's reserve bank account. As you may

know, the reserve account is used exclusively for repairs, major maintenance, and replacement of the Association's common area components. The reserve account does not supply the operations account with money, and money cannot be co-mingled between the accounts. (In the event money is borrowed between the accounts, which we have NOT had to do, that money must be paid back just like a loan from a bank, and within the fiscal year.) According to our CPA/Auditor, we have

surpassed his request for additional reserve money in our account; that was by some \$69,000 as of the first of the year, and is based upon a "fully funded" reserve model. The current balance in the ever changing reserve account is around \$428,000. We expect that balance will exceed half a million dollars before the end of the fiscal year, an amount that represents roughly \$200,000 more than we have had under the care and custody of past boards.

In our continuing and ongoing efforts to maintain Association assets:

• We have just completed painting the exterior on all the Association buildings. Although there were differing opinions, initially, about the color of the paint that was chosen, the completed paint job with white trim looks great. And, by using the best quality of paint, it will probably last a lot longer than we will!

- We plan to replace seven toilets in the women's restrooms to make them ADA compliant.
- We will be looking to remodel two women's bathrooms.
- We plan to replace the heater core in the Arts & Crafts Building.
- We will also be replacing the air conditioner in the Pro Shop. Not only is the current one many years old, it is undersized for the area, which led to its recent demise due to overload. The replacement will be one with a bigger capacity.

We are slowly progressing through the painful due diligence for the remodel of the Crown Center pool building. We believe we are cutting the costs to reach our projected budget. The Pool Construction committee meets every Friday at the Clubhouse, and you are welcome to observe. For the record,

the decision regarding the lap pool has not been made.

With the pool remodel, the unspoken words we hear from time to time are "What's in it for me?" When we don't use the pool, or the golf course, or the bowling green, or the shuffleboard, or any of the Association facilities for that matter, sometimes we don't want to pay for them, even if we may have enjoyed them at one time. Unfortunately, it seems that as we get older, we participate in activities less and less, though we've been told that if we would use assets like the pool, we would lead a much better quality of life.

Maybe you honestly feel that you don't leave your house much anymore and you really don't want to invest more of your money to make things better in the community. You may have lived here for a long time,

King City Travel Club News

AUGUST 11, 2016 — BONNEVILLE DAM TRIP

On August 11, 2016 the King City Travel Club will visit the Bonneville Lock and Dam and Fish Hatchery. It is located 145 river miles from the mouth of the Columbia River and about 40 miles east of Portland, Oregon, near Cascade Locks, Oregon, and North Bonneville, Washington.

The project's first powerhouse, spillway and original navigation lock were completed in 1938 to improve navigation on the Columbia River and provide hydropower to the Pacific Northwest. A second powerhouse was completed in 1981, and a larger navigation lock in 1993.

It was a Public Works Administration project of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's New Deal. During a campaign speech he delivered in Portland, Oregon, in 1932, he highly touted the benefits of cheap hydroelectric power. Bonneville Dam was funded in 1937, spanning the Columbia River for 3,460 feet. Portions of Bonneville Lock and Dam Project were declared a National Historic Landmark in 1987. The Bonneville Power Administration is the overseer of 31 dams in the region. They are in charge of marketing the electrical power produced by the dams, which are operated by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the Bureau of Reclamation.

During the trip to Bonneville Dam, if walking is a problem for you, you may want to opt not to do the powerhouse tour and the lock tour and to spend more time in the underwater viewing rooms looking at the fish passing by in one of the fish counting machines.

Together we can all enjoy the hatchery operation and seeing the large sturgeon and trout in their pond.

The bus will depart the KCCA library parking lot promptly at 8:00am. Please arrive in time to sign in and choose your seat on the bus. We will return to the same location at approximately 3:30pm.

Reservations must be made by July 30, 2016. No refunds will be made after that date. To participate in

this adventure, you must be a Travel Club member. Annual dues are \$4 and can be paid in a separate check from the cost of the trip. The checks are to be placed in the Travel Club slot at the KCCA office. Cost of the trip is \$39, which includes transportation, food and all gratuities. If you have a care person, that person must pay for their space on the trip.




