# PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

Guess what? It's already August and, starting on Saturday, the 13th, KCCA is helping the City of King City to celebrate its 50th Anniversary! A whole week of fun and "happenings" is scheduled, and you are invited to get involved! See the Anniversary Schedule of Events on Pages 6 and 7 for more information.

The KCCA Board of Directors has recently fielded some questions regarding our current reserve account as it compares to the reserves of around 2012. Here is a recap. If you go back to 2012, under the care custody and control of the last board, our reserve account was at \$178,039. At the end of 2013, our reserve account was at \$270,549, with most association assets in different stages of disrepair. Over the past two years, after spending approximately \$200,000 to repair, replace, and/or improve a whole host of things, many of which had previously been "kicked down the road" for lack of money, we now have \$450,000 in the reserve account. KCCA assets are now in far better (Continued on Page 3)

#### **Notes from the Technology** Committee

Good news: after a long and very involved process, the new website is almost here! Effective August 1, it will go live and you can check it out at mykcca. com. While there will be some sections still under construction, it will be substantially completed and will be fully functional in a matter of weeks. The old site will remain active through August 25, for

those of you who want to check out any current information that is not yet available on the new site.

For the 1,000+ current registered members, we are working on having you log in with the current information on the old site. If this turns out to not be possible (due to the old site being extremely difficult to get proprietary information to us), it will be simple to re-register.

I would like to talk about some misleading information that has been passed around lately. Apparently, some people do not understand the issue of security on a site nor the information that will be held on site. To correct the information:

- · This site will not ask for any information that you don't want to give, the same as with the old site.
- We will not give out information to any third party regarding information you have on the site (all we will ask for is your name and address to register, nothing else).
- We will not know your password, just your user name. When you first register, we will give you a one-time password. You can then change your password to anything you choose.
- · We never did, and we will not, ask for Social Security numbers, bank accounts, driver's license, or any other information that can identify you.

If you still do not want access to the new site, please put it in writing and give it to the office. We will be happy to remove it.

condition and we are now far better off financially.

Our auditor, respected CPA and corporate accountant David T. Schwindt, has been KCCA's paid financial expert for a number of years. At this year's annual members' meeting, Mr. Schwindt told all of us that we were far exceeding his requested amount of reserves and that we had exceeded it by \$69,000. That was in May; the excess is now much greater. Our reserve account and reserve budget are improving in leaps and bounds.

Thank you, Paul Downing and the rest of the Board, for "thinking outside the box" and working hard to improve both the condition of our assets and the overall financial health of our community.





Since 1955, in a picturesque setting on the south end of the "World's Smallest Harbor," Depoe Bay hosts an "Indian Style Salmon Bake." Before sunrise on Saturday morning, volunteers will ignite a huge 80-foot fire lined with six cords of fir and three cords of alder. Approximately 3000 pounds of salmon will be roasted. Salmon fillets are positioned on alder wood stakes and held in place with cedar strips. The alder stakes are then positioned diagonally over the smoldering fire line and slow roasted to perfection just as the Native Americans did more than 2,000 years ago.



Trade Commission's (FTC's) efforts to shut down the scammers that target active older adults. You may get a call from someone who says he's a computer technician. He might say he's from a well-known company like Microsoft, or maybe your internet service provider. He tells you there are viruses or other malware on your computer. He says you'll have to give him remote access to your computer or buy new software to fix it.

These scammers might want to sell you useless services, steal your credit card number, or get access to your computer to install malware, which could then let them see everything on your computer.

#### **Tech Tip**

Here's what you can do to stop the scammers:

- Hang up. Never give control of your computer or your credit card information to someone who calls you out of the blue.
- Pass this information on to a friend. You might know
