Janet and Julie present a varied program with classical pieces, show tunes, and always something for "fun." Besides being outstanding musicians, these performers are extremely personable and interact well with our audience.

Janet Coleman, a versatile and dynamic pianist, received her Bachelor of Arts degree from Willamette University and her Master's in music from the University of Oregon, where she was named Outstanding Chamber Musician. For several seasons, Janet was coach/accompanist with the Linfield College and Portland State University Opera Workshop programs, Eugene Opera and Portland Opera's Education and Outreach tours. Summer activities have included performances at the Aspen Music Festival, Bel Canto Northwest, Portland Opera Performance Institute, Astoria Music Festival, and the Oregon Bach Festival.

Julie Coleman studied the violin with Raphael Spiro before gaining admittance to The Juilliard School at age 17. Julie is fortunate to know Pink Martini's talented leader, Thomas Lauderdale, since the mid-90's and is a part of many exciting recordings and performances as a member of the Harvey Rosencranz Orchestra, a string group that occasionally accompanies the band. Some highlights include the David Letterman Show, Hollywood Bowl, Carnegie Hall, the

grand opening of Disney Hall and, most recently, a live New Year's Eve television broadcast to Japan. Ms. Coleman is a proud member of the twice Grammy nominated Oregon Symphony and plays on a beautifully restored G. B. Rogeri violin made in 1667.

At the August BOD meeting, the directors accepted the resignation of Mike Whitmarsh and voted Roger Burke onto the board as Mike’s replacement. Before introducing Roger, I would like to thank my brother, Mike, for his honesty, his sense of humor, his hard work, and his dedication to the Board of Directors of KCCA. Although Mike will still be with us as friend and neighbor, his talent and positive spirit will be missed by the Board.

Now I want to welcome to the Board our newest director, Roger Burke, retired CPA and a true expert in his field. Roger, our seventh Board member, was voted to serve as Treasurer. Following is Roger’s letter of introduction. I think you will appreciate what Roger has to say.

“Hi, I am Roger Burke, the new Association treasurer. My wife, Linda, and I moved here last year. I am a third generation Portlander. I went to Benson High, and got my degree from Portland State with the help of the G.I. Bill. I took what seems now to be a mountain of courses in accounting, business, and high level math. That simply means I am probably the most boring guy in the room.

“After the required two years of internship under CPAs and passing a long, long exam where some of the participants cried, some got sick on the floor, and some simply ran out of the exam room never to be seen again, I passed and earned my CPA license in the State of Oregon.

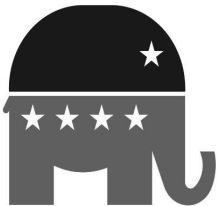

East Washington County Democratic Caucus (EWCDC)

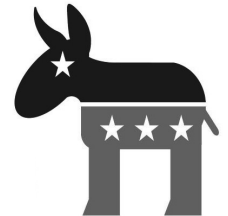

Tech News and Tips from the Computer Club

Tech News

Scammers have found ways to create realistic but phony “security alerts.” Though the “alerts” look like they’re being generated by your computer, they actually are created by a con artist and sent through your internet browser. These programs are called “scareware” because they exploit a person’s fear of online viruses and security threats. Scareware purveyors also go to great lengths to make their product and service look legitimate. For example, if you buy the software, you may get an email receipt with a customer service phone number. If you call, you’re likely to be connected to someone, but that alone does not mean the company is legitimate. Regardless, remember that these are well organized and profitable schemes designed to rip people off.

Tech Tips

Here’s what you can do to stop the scammers:

If you’re faced with any of the warning signs of a

scareware scam or suspect a problem, shut down your browser. Don’t click “No” or “Cancel,” or even the “x” at the top right corner of the screen. Some scareware is designed so that any of those buttons can activate the program. If you use Windows, press Ctrl + Alt + Delete to open your Task Manager, and click “End Task.” If you use a Mac, press Command + Option + Q + Esc to “Force Quit.” Make it a practice not to click on any links within pop-ups.

Please Report Scams

If you spot a scam, please report it to the Federal Trade Commission (FTC). Report a scam online at <https://www.ftc.gov/complaint> or call the FTC at 1-877-FTC-HELP (1-877-382-4357). Your complaint can help protect other people. Be sure to report fraud to your credit card company for a refund.

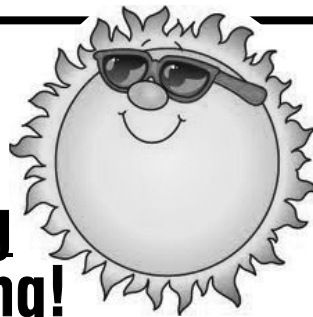

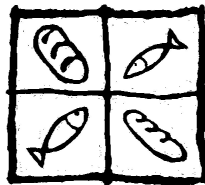


King-NET Reminder

ARE WE MISSING SOMETHING?

A man sat at a metro station in Washington DC and started to play the violin; it was a cold January morning. He played six Bach pieces for about 45 minutes. During that time, since it was rush hour, it was calculated that thousands of people went through the station, most of them on their way to work.

Three minutes went by and a middle aged man noticed there was a musician playing. He slowed his pace and stopped for a few seconds and then hurried up to meet his schedule.

A minute later, the violinist received his first dollar tip: a woman threw the money in the till and without stopping continued to

walk.

A few minutes later, someone leaned against the wall to listen to him, but the man looked at his watch and started to walk again. Clearly he was late for work.

The one who paid the most attention was a 3-year-old boy. His mother tagged him along, hurried, but the kid stopped to look at the violinist. Finally the mother pushed hard and the child continued to walk, turning his head all the time. This action was repeated by several other children. All the parents, without exception, forced them to move on.

In the 45 minutes the musician played, only six people stopped and stayed for a while. About 20 gave him money, but continued to walk their normal pace. He

collected \$32. When he finished playing and silence took over, no one noticed it. No one applauded, nor was there any recognition.

No one knew this, but the violinist was Joshua Bell, one of the best musicians in the world. He played one of the most intricate pieces ever written with a violin worth 3.5 million dollars. Two days before his playing in the subway, Joshua Bell sold out at a theater in Boston and the seats averaged \$100.

This is a real story. Joshua Bell playing incognito in the metro station was organized by the *Washington Post* as part of a social experiment about perception, taste, and priorities of people. The outlines were: in a commonplace environment at an inappropriate

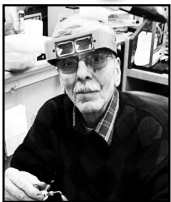
