However, did you know AEDs are not to be used on someone who has a pacemaker? A few weeks ago, I had the occasion to call 911 for a friend. The 911 operator asked right away if we had an AED unit. Only because I knew the person in distress and knew he had a pacemaker, was I able to tell 911 so the AED would not be administered. If I hadn't known and had used the AED unit, I very likely could have done harm to my friend.

Do you, or does someone you know, have a pacemaker? Should something happen, how would we know? Are you wearing anything that would let us know about your special needs? Please consider wearing some kind of an alert.

What do "Universal Design" and "Aging in Place" Mean?

There is a growing contingent of people over 50 years old who are choosing to renovate their existing homes instead of moving to alternative living options.

Most people are deeply connected with their home and community, preferring to remain in their home for life. This movement is called Aging in Place, or Universal Design, which is focused on increasing liveability through accessibility (accommodating walkers, wheelchairs, inability to climb stairs, etc).

Financially, the cost of adding high value renovations is often a much more inexpensive option than the comparable costs of assisted living or nursing homes.

The most qualified remodelers to do this kind of work are those with a Certified Aging in Place Specialist (CAPS) certification and a proven track record working with aging clients. Ideally, the remodeling company would have a team of architects, interior designers, and medical suppliers who specialize in aging upgrades.

Some common aging-in-place modifications are:

- First floor living and redesign
- · Kitchen and bath accessibility remodels
- · Widened doorways and hallways
- Installing pocket doors versus swinging doors
- No-step entryways
- Flooring changes
- Installing stair glides Brighter lighting upgrades

When considering adapting your home to your needs as you age, whether the changes are large or small, it is advisable to (1) check with the Oregon Construction Contractors Board regarding the contractor you are considering using, (2) find out if the contractor has CAPS certification and experience with aging-in-place or universal design upgrades, (3) get references to the company's customers, and (4) ask your neighbors, such as through King-NET, what they know about the contractor.

NOVEMBER 18, 2016 – TRIP TO ALBERTINA KERR

On November 18, 2016 the KC Travel Club will visit the Albertina Kerr Center.

In 1903 when Alexander H. Kerr established a home canning supplies business, the company with offices in Portland, Oregon, was called the Hermetic Fruit Jar Companv. In what was a scandal at the time, Kerr divorced his wife to marry Albertina Sechtem, who was 28 years his junior. Sechtem and Kerr were wed on September 29. 1910. Albertina moved into Alexander's house. Shortly after their son John was born, the Kerrs traveled to Camp Rilea on the Oregon Coast and Long Beach, Washington, and Albertina contracted typhoid fever while on the trip. She died on October 17, 1911. Her deathbed wish to her husband was: "Look after other motherless babies, too."

Alexander donated their home to the Pacific Coast Rescue Society for use as a home for orphans. The home, which provided adoption services and daycare for the children of single mothers, opened in 1913 and quickly became too small; Alexander and his third wife, Ruth, raised money for a larger building at Northeast 22nd Avenue and Sandy Boulevard that opened in 1921 as the Albertina Kerr Nursery. The nursery operated until 1967, when the organization changed to a foster care approach. The original building on Sandy Boulevard was reopened in 1981 as Albertina's Restaurant and antique and consignment shops. One of the restaurant's signature dishes is a cheesecake served in a 4-ounce Kerr canning jar.

During our visit to the Albertina Kerr Center, we will have time to shop. We will have a Holiday lunch which will include all the trimmings for Thanksgiving. The cost of the trip will be \$45, which includes transportation and lunch. All gratuities are included. Resevations must be made before November 4th. No

refunds will be made after that date. Our bus will leave from the KCCA library parking lot at 10:30am and return at approximately 5:00pm. Be sure to arrive in time to sign in, get your badge, and choose your seat on the bus. Remember, to participate in this adventure, you must be a KC Travel Club member. Annual dues are \$4, which is to be paid in a separate check from the cost of the trip. The checks are to be placed in the Travel Club slot at the Clubhouse Office. If you have a care person, that person must pay for their space on the trip.
