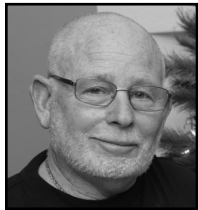

Greetings! We are continuing to collect 2017 HOA assessments. If you have not yet paid yours, please call or visit the office as soon as possible. The dues are \$353.00 this year and can also be paid by credit or debit card.

The office has received a lot of complaints recently from folks who are finding dog droppings in their yards. Unless you have permission from the homeowner, please do not allow your dog to walk onto their property. Article VII, Section 5 of the CC&R's refers to animals and states that "Pet owners are responsible for the immediate removal of their pet's waste and for any damage or

injury caused by their pet." Failure to pick up after your pet can result in a \$10.00 daily fine to the pet owner. The fine schedule can be found under Resolution 2012-308.

Many of you visit the Clubhouse regularly, and you have seen how busy it can get up here. I like to joke around and say, "Every day is like Monday!" Which is not far from the truth because every day there is something new to work on, deal with, resolve, fix, or attend to. And the phones are also always ringing off the hook. We are in the office every day from 9:00am to 5:00pm, with the exception of Friday, of course, when the window closes at 1:00pm. We do not necessarily leave at 1:00, but we do close the blinds to attempt to catch up. If you call and we do not answer, it is only because we are attending to someone else. During regular business hours, our Administrator and staff are caring and resourceful, but of course they are not always available and, on occasion, they may need help. Our hope is that this committee can be of help and provide a greater sense of security in our community.

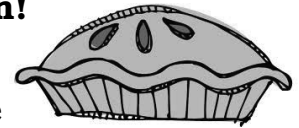

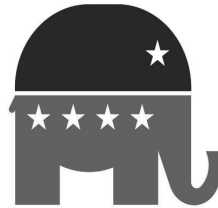
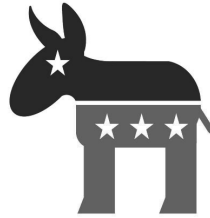
East Washington County Democratic Caucus (EWCDC)
