PRESIDENT'S COLUMN

We can look forward to warm days and warm nights, picnics in the park, barbecues on the patio, social functions at the clubhouse, and visits to the coast and the beautiful mountains of Oregon. Sunshine will chase away the winter blues and make us feel free once more. I hope all of you make plans to live life to its fullest this year!

As you may know, last month we encountered a couple of crisis situations in the office. One was the publication of our May monthly newsletter. For some time, the publisher has had the same person put our newsletter together, and she has done an excellent job for us. Unfortunately, due to illness, that individual was away from work for about a month. Katherine Griffith and Valerie Schuyler had worked long hours to make sure our information was prepared correctly and submitted to the publisher on time, which it was. However, when the proof came back, current articles were mixed up with those of the previous month's publication. Valerie dove back in and got it corrected, but it took several days longer than it would have, had that not happened. Thus, the announcement for the election of the board came out a few days late.

The good part of all this is that we were able to add two of the new candidates who didn't have their bios and pictures in to meet the original deadline. For ALL of us, I would like to thank Katherine and Valerie for their long hours and hard work, and Julie, our temporary office assistant, for being so supportive in the situation.

The annual members' meeting was held on May 9, 2017 and we had an excellent turnout. The five candidates who are running for the board were introduced, gave their presentations, and answered questions from the audience. One of the questions asked of me, as an incumbent, was why we don't produce a financial report each month. Well, contrary to the rumor mill, we do. Copies of the monthly financial report are available to everyone at monthly board meetings; the annual meeting being no exception. The reason I address this here, is that it seems some people would want you to believe that we do things in secret. Not true. Except when the board meets in executive session,

all meetings of the board of directors are open to members. Here is the process and it is visible to all:

At our monthly workshop, we address all the agenda items that will be discussed or voted on at the monthly board meeting. An agenda is produced and posted 24 hours in advance of the workshop and, following the workshop, the agenda for the Board of Directors meeting is posted. Prior to start of the board meeting, a sign-up sheet is made available for anyone who would like to address the board during open forum. At the end of the meeting, those who signed up to speak are called on and may ask questions of, or give input directly to the board. At that point, everything is clearly out in the open and has been laid out in front of everyone. Minutes of the board meetings are posted. In addition, once they have been approved, the minutes are added to our website, www.mykcca.com.

It seems we have a handful of people who feel they should be the ones who make the decisions and they should be the ones who are listened to – above anybody else in the community. To them I say, you are welcome to run for the Board of Directors, the governing body of this corporation and HOA. Forty-eight is the number; maybe an additional three. That's 51, but what does that number mean? Well, in the name of transparency and community involvement, in the last two years we have added eight board-directed committees. The number of people participating on those committees is 48. That means 48 more people involved and contributing to KCCA. (By the way, the three additional is the number of people we plan to ask to serve on a newsletter committee.) Of course, we do have more committees with more members, including the standing committees that have been around for years. All told, how many people work with the KCCA Board? A lot. Now that's transparency. If you don't want to run for the board, lend your time and skills to the community by volunteering to serve, or just help as needed, on one of the committees.

If this newsletter comes out on time, it will mean we have not yet voted for new Board members. I will say this again, we have five great candidates for the job of director and we can't go wrong with any of them. I want to thank each of you for running and tell you from experience, at least as an officer of the Board, it can be a fulltime job. So, lace up your boots and dive into the action!

PLEASE NOTE: Jim Armour submitted his notice to withdraw from the KCCA Board of Directors election shortly after the KCCA Members' Meeting on May 9.

Also, KCCA residents who are renters ARE definitely allowed and encouraged to vote for KCCA Board candidates. Please plan to stop by and vote on election day, May 30, or contact the KCCA front office for an absentee ballot if you cannot make it that day.

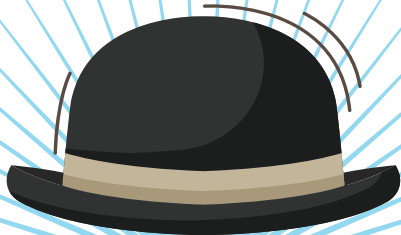

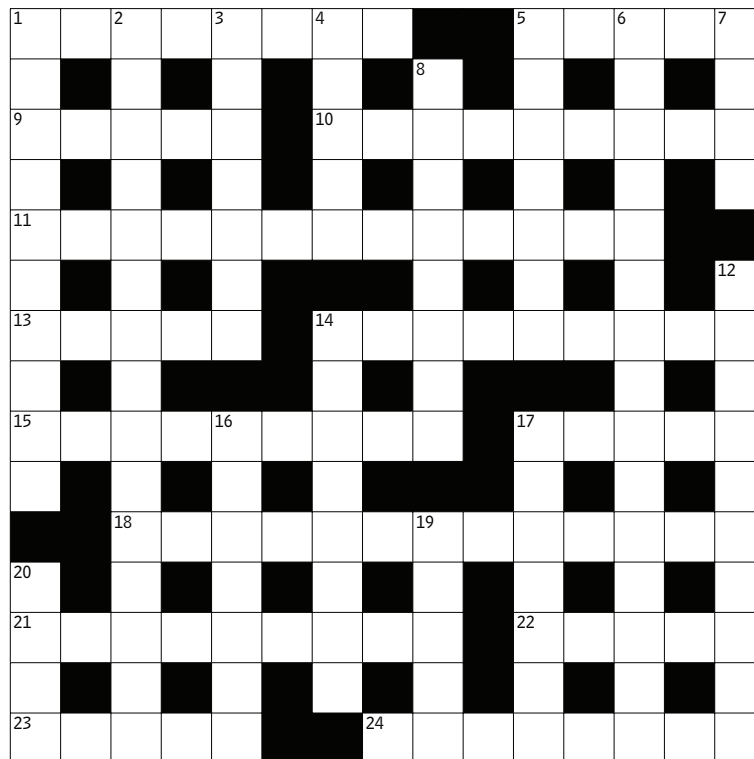

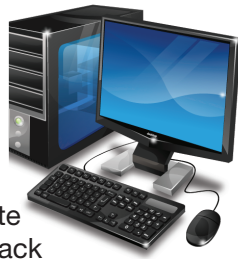

Tech News-According to the website ReCode, Gmail users are under attack in a gigantic phishing operation that's spreading like wildfire across the internet right now. People are receiving an email that looks like an invitation to join a Google Document from someone they know. But when you click on the link to open the file, you activate a program that sends spam emails to everyone you've emailed. If you receive an email like this, do not open it. If you've clicked "Allow" in the Google Docs prompt, you've been tricked. Here's what to do if you have been (or think you have been) compromised by the attack: Go to your Google account management page. If you see an app called Google Docs, click on it to revoke permission for the app to access your account. Then change your Google (Gmail) password, just to be safe.

Tech Tip-The bad guys are always trying to fool us. Don't fall for the phone scams that pretend to be from Microsoft saying that something is wrong with your computer. Microsoft will never call you. Also, hang up on the call pretending to be from the IRS – they will never call you. When using your computer don't click on any of the ads that say they will fix or speed up your computer. And never call any of the phone numbers that show up in pop-up ads. They are all scams.

The "What's New" class on the first Saturday covers recent technology announcements and provides a Question & Answer session for computer issues. 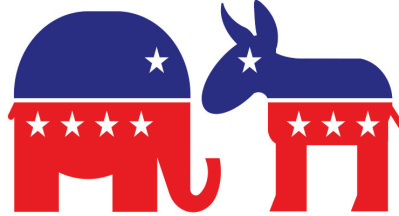

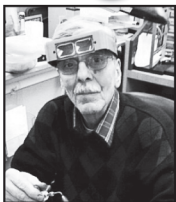
