The Federal Trade Commission, along with federal, state and international law enforcement partners, recently announced “Operation Tech Trap,” a nationwide and international crackdown on tech support scams that trick consumers into believing their computers are infected with viruses and malware and then charge them hundreds of dollars for unnecessary repairs and services.

## TECH TIP

Be aware that many popups will claim to be from Microsoft or Apple claiming that your computer is infected. Do not call the posted phone number! Simply close your browser and restart your computer. If you know someone who has fallen for the scam, have them contact their credit card company and report the charges as fraudulent.

## SATURDAY CLASSES

Computer classes are continuing the first four Saturdays every month at 10:00am, in the computer room in the Arts & Crafts Building. The “What’s New” class on the first Saturday covers recent technology announcements and provides a question and answer session for computer issues. 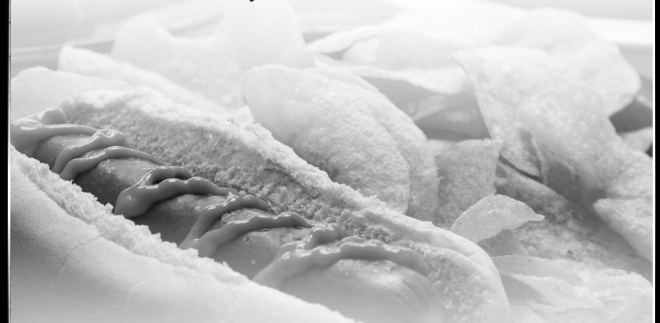
