



"Transforming." That's how Kathy Sparnins, a former Portland resident, long-time grief educator, and first-time filmmaker, describes the documentary film that has consumed her life for several years. Sparnins is the Co-Producer of "Voices of Grief, Honoring the Sacred Journey." Through her experience as a grief educator, Sparnins became aware of how death- and griefphobic our culture has become. The documentary weaves together interviews, insights from contemporary authors, poets and spiritual teachers, and the stories of people who talk about their own very personal experiences with grief. The Federal Trade Commission, along with federal, state and international law enforcement partners, recently announced "Operation Tech Trap," a nationwide and international crackdown on tech support scams that trick consumers into believing their computers are infected with viruses and malware and then charge them hundreds of dollars for unnecessary repairs and services.

TECH TIP

Be aware that many popups will claim to be from Microsoft or Apple claiming that your computer is infected. Do not call the posted phone number! Simply close your browser and restart your computer. If you know someone who has fallen for the scam, have them contact their credit card company and report the charges as fraudulent.

SATURDAY CLASSES

The "What's New" class on the first Saturday covers recent technology announcements and provides a question and answer session for computer issues.
