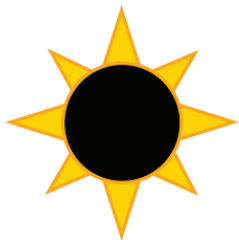
If you can get to the clubhouse to play cards or go to the computer classes etc., this is not a

August 19, 2017

Trip to Ft. Vancouver, WA

A little bit of history is right in our back yard. On August 19, 2017, the KC Travel Club will travel across the Columbia River to Fort Vancouver and learn about its importance in the settlement of the Pacific Northwest and the impact of the fur trade.

While at the Fort we will take a self-guided tour. There are replicas of houses, a garden, orchard and various other historical objects for the curious; and those who appreciate history. We will also visit Officers Row, a beautiful tree lined street with twenty-two fully-restored nineteenth century homes, situated on twenty-one acres just north of the Vancouver Barracks Parade Grounds. All the homes are listed on the National Historic Register.

After touring the historical sites, we will lunch at the Grant House, where we will select from a special menu of Caesar salad, Chef's choice-1/2 sandwich, with soup and salad or quiche of the day.

The cost of the trip will be \$40 which will include transportation, gratuities, lunch and any entry fees. The bus will leave from the KCCA Library parking lot at 9:00a.m. and return at approximately 4:00 p.m. To participate in this adventure, you must be a KC Travel Club member. Annual dues are \$5 and can be paid in a separate check from the cost of the trip. The checks are to be placed in the Travel Club slot at the Clubhouse Office. If you have a care person, that person must pay for their space on the trip. Reservations must be made no later than August 12, 2017. No refunds will be made after that date. DO NOT PAY BEFORE making reservations.

Trip to Seattle for Two Nights and Three Days

KC Travel Club will head to Seattle for a two-night, three-day fun-filled adventure that begins on September 28 when we leave the KCCA Library parking lot at 8:30 a.m. We will arrive at the hotel and prepare to walk to the Seattle Center for lunch. The Seattle Center was built for the 1962 World's Fair. Unfortunately we will not be eating at the Space Needle. The restaurant will be remodeled beginning September 1, 2017, how-

ever there are many interesting places to taste Seattle's foods at various restaurants. When we have finished lunch the Chihuly Garden and Glass exhibition and museum await us. After the tour of the museum your time will be yours to enjoy. Dinner will be shared when the day is concluded.

The next morning, we will have a scrumptious breakfast to get us started for another fun filled day. We will head to the harbor and board the Bainbridge Island Ferry. A full day of shopping in interesting shops, little eateries and other places to discover will fill your day. We will board the ferry for our return to the "mainland" and a short stroll from pier 53 to 54 where dinner will be served at Ivar's Acres of Clams. During our time in Seattle there will be an extra surprise.

The cost of the trip will be \$430. The price includes transportation, hotel, gratuities and all meals. Reservations must be made no later than August 28, 2017 in order to confirm the names of those attending and hotel room assignments made. No refunds will be made after August 28. 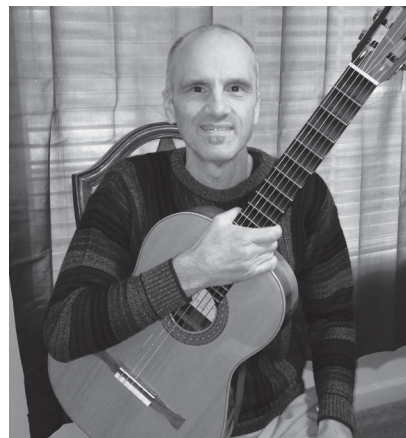

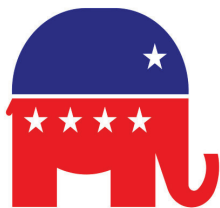

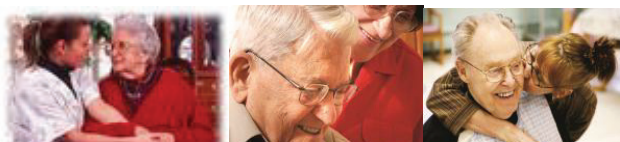

TECH NEWS

A recent article in USA Today reports that scammers have found a new way to fool us by targeting our text messages. It is called “smishing.” While the name of this growing threat might sound funny, being a victim of it is no joke. Similar to a “phishing” scam — where computer users receive an authentic-looking email that appears to be from their bank, Internet Service Provider (ISP), favorite store, or other organization — “smishing” messages are sent to you via SMS (text message) on your mobile phone. **What does the sender want? To defraud you. Don’t fall for the trap.**

TECH TIP

If you get a suspicious looking text (or email) on your phone and it asks you to urgently confirm information, it’s not coming from a legitimate institution. Therefore, don’t reply and don’t tap on the link in the message. Simply delete it. Your bank, financial institution, ISP or favorite online retailer will never ask for sensitive information via email or text. When in doubt, contact the company yourself by phone.

SATURDAY CLASSES

Computer classes are continuing on the first four Saturdays every month at 10:00 a.m. in the computer room in the Arts & Crafts Building. The “What’s New” class on the 1st Saturday covers recent technology announcements and provides a Question & Answer session for computer issues. 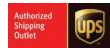

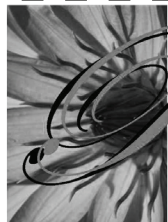
