## INDOOR POOL CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

July has been a very busy month. We have received the last of our required permits and are relieved the permit process is complete. Here are other updates:

- Cascade Pool poured the cement for the lap pools and hot tub and installed the coping and completed the modified steps on the existing pool. However, plumbing was really the focus for July. Because it all took place underground it may have seemed as if nothing was going on, but a lot of things were going on.
- Our facility is 50+ years old and like most plumbing of this age, the pipes had rotted, collapsed and needed to be replaced. You may recall hearing about pipes bursting in downtown Portland on the nightly news during the past year, which was due to rotted pipes, so finding our pipes in the same condition was to be expected.
- What we didn't expect to find were pipes laid like an underground snake pit with very little logic to the original layout. However, this facility was built during the era of flower power and hallucinogenic so perhaps it made perfect sense to them. One example of this is that one of the men's bathrooms and the kitchen sink in the Crown Center drained out to the rotted pool plumbing and not the plumbing in the Crown Center, so we had to re-route that plumbing. This is why there was trenching outside the front of the Crown Center.
- There were a lot of pipes and plumbing to install that were outside of the original scope of work, which added time and materials, but it was necessary if we all want to turn on a faucet or be able to flush a toilet when needed.
- When our contractor was working near the PGE line that ran to the Crown Center earlier this spring, they did **not** find the PGE line where it was marked so they started hand-digging until they found the line, which was 7' away from the PGE line marker.

### WEST SIDE OF BUILDING

Now let's turn our attention to the west side of the building (facing 126th) and the gas line source for the furnace located on the west side that heats the Crown Center:

- NW Natural is responsible for running the gas line from the gas source to the meter on the outside of the building and install a Locates wire with that line, identifying the location of the gas line – normally on the outside of the building. Long story short, a gas line was hit during construction, but they turned off the gas immediately at the meter and now additional work is being done to reroute the gas line properly.

**The good news is that no one was hurt, the plumbing to the Crown Center is complete, the sprinklers have been repaired, the lawn will be reseeded, and we once again have heat, water, and functioning toilets in the Crown Center.**

### WHAT TO EXPECT NEXT

- The Crown Center wall, windows and fire doors have been installed and the exterior siding, interior paint and bathroom floor repairs will be completed by mid-August.
- Once the final touches are complete and the construction site is secured, the Crown Center can be re-opened

- Plumbing under the floor slab was scheduled to be completed today and inspection is scheduled for tomorrow
- Cascade Pool will finish the piping in the equipment room and then KKLA can backfill and compact, hopefully by the end of next week
- At this point excavation should be complete and paving the parking lot will be scheduled, which will help control the dust
- Framing is projected to begin end of next week or the following, depending on when the concrete floor is poured. Framing will take 4-5 weeks to complete.

Thank you everyone for your continuing patience. It will be exciting to see the finished project at the end of the year.

## KCCA TRANSFER FEES RAISED TO 1.5%

On August 18th, at a Special Meeting of the Board of Directors of King City Civic Association, the Directors voted unanimously to raise the transfer fee charged for new residents to 1.5% to take effect in September, once the increase is filed with Washington County. These fees will be deposited to the KCCA Reserve Account that is designated for capital improvements for the community assets.

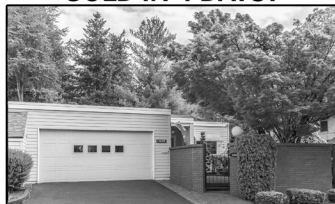

from the 1920's era.

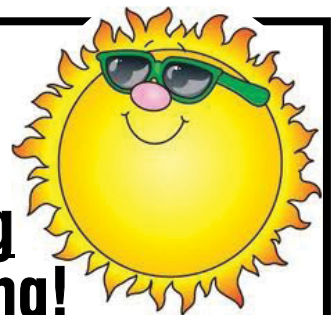
The usual refreshments will be provided following the performance by Regina Muter of TransAmerica Financial Advi-

Scammers have found ways to create realistic but phony “security alerts.” Though the “alerts” look like they’re being generated by your computer, they actually are created by a con artist and sent through your Internet browser. These programs are called “scareware” because they exploit a person’s fear of online viruses and security threats. Scareware purveyors also go to great lengths to make their product and service look legitimate. For example, if you buy the software, you may get an email receipt with a customer service phone number. If you call, you’re likely to be connected to someone, but that alone does not mean the company is legitimate. Regardless, remember that these are well-organized and profitable schemes designed to rip people off.

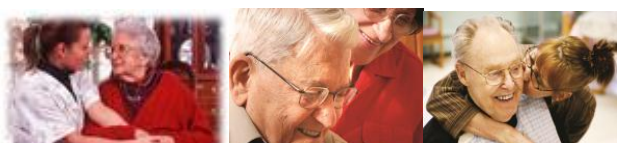

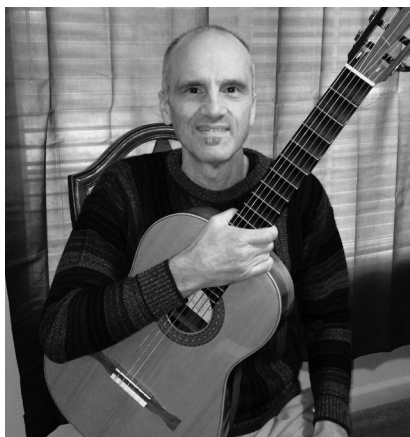

The King City Camera Club meets from September through May to provide local photographers the opportunity to show their work and improve their skills. Meetings are held on the second, third, and fourth Mondays of each month at the King City Civic Association Clubhouse at 7:30 p.m. Each week has a different theme.

Picture takers of all skill levels are encouraged to participate. Photographing is more in the eye of the photographer than it is in the equipment. A smart phone user can often take better pictures than the user of an expensive DSLR camera. Newer photographers will have the opportunity to learn by observing the work of others, some of them professional, and maybe the newer photographer may show the "old hand" a new trick.

The second Monday is **Competition Night**. Members show both printed images and/or projected images. These images are judged and critiqued, providing the photographer with an opportunity to get an independent review of their work coupled with comments to guide them toward taking better pictures. 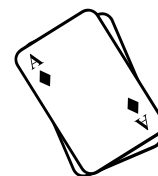

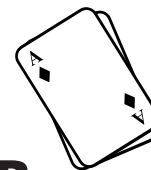
