

Aquatic Center Update

After three long challenging years of planning and construction our new Aquatic Center is getting closer to completion. For the first time in 15 months we have water in all the pools! While the plaster is curing over the next four weeks we'll focus on completing some final touches and inspections.

Our objective was to build an Aquatic Center we can be proud of, that enhances our lives and increases our property values... and I believe to that end we are successful.

- Current estimated construction cost is \$1,718,800 (including tasks yet to be completed by the KCCA such as parking lot seal/striping, landscaping & irrigation system replacement.)
- Potential increase in property values.
- Project cost estimated at 14% below the 2016 Reserve Study estimate of \$2M to rebuild the pool facility and repair the Crown Center.


Our Aquatic Center could not have been successful without the

countless hours spent by resident volunteers on the Pool Committee and Pool Fundraising Committees. Our HOA structure is built and depends on many volunteers, in multiple capacities, and the KCCA cannot thrive without them.

KCCA Water Aerobics Club

Our club has been operating in King City for almost 27 consecutive years. Since February 2017, when construction started on the new pool, we have been mostly pooless. With the generous assistance from the golfing community, we were able to use the outdoor pool for our routines summer 2017. Since the new pool opening has had construction delays, we will resume exercising in the outdoor pool when it opens for summer 2018. Yea!

Water Aerobic exercise is a safe, non-weight bearing workout, especially helpful for Seniors with physical issues of arthritis, joint and various movement problems. Because water reduces pressure, it lessens stress on bones, joints and muscles while toning, strengthening and burning calories. Water exercise is well-tolerated and effective because each person can work as little or as hard as their physical ability allows.

We follow three different instructional CDs for our exercise routines. Each is about 50 minutes in length. You will need to be patient with yourself because listening to directions takes some concentration and effort, but as

soon as you start moving, the physical benefits begin. It is so liberating! The only thing needed to participate is a comfortable swimsuit (one that stays in place and moves with you).

We are a non-profit organization with a Charter and elected officers, with meetings as necessary; usually one annual meeting for elections. We charge \$5 per year to join, payable with your application for membership. The fee is used to purchase and maintain equipment, for operational costs, and any fees charged by KCCA.

Two sessions every Monday through Friday will be held in the outdoor pool for summer of 2018 at 10 am and again at 7pm. Communications within membership is maintained through email, and through the KCCA newsletter.

If you are eager to try our program, come and see what we do. Watch for the announcement of the outdoor pool opening. Or, for more information, call 503-719-2996.

Please NOTE: you must be a KCCA member to join and must be at least 18. No lifeguards are present. Everyone participates at their own risk. GET WET... GET FIT!

An increasing number of older adults become newly-homeless, or unable to pay rent on a timely basis due to hospitalization with no friends or family to pick up the pieces. Often their worldly goods are just left on the curb. If already homeless, they just lost that last bit. Right now, the SNF that Josanne Steadman works in has 3-100% disabled vets, one special ed teacher, and 1 retired engineer. All without garments, shoes, glasses, or dentures. When our chapter heard of this need, the bags of donations started flowing in every week. The closet is full now and two nearby SNFs are gladly taking the overflow.

KCCA Outdoor Pool Now Open

The King City Civic Association outdoor pool officially opened for the season on Friday, May 25. The outdoor pool is open Monday through Sunday (all seven days) from 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. or dusk, (whichever is earlier). Children under the age of 18 are allowed in the outdoor pool with a resident between the hours of 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m.

We encourage all residents to enjoy the outdoor pool as much as possible, and to that end, everyone should follow the rules and respect fellow residents' time and safety while at the pool. The following are just **SOME** of the outdoor pool rules. The entire set of pool rules is available online at www.mykcca. com and printed copies are in the rack in the lobby of the KCCA Clubhouse.

The facility includes a single large main pool that is divided with a safety rope between the deep and shallower ends of the pool. The Pro-Shop dressing rooms, bathrooms, and shower facilities are also available for Resident Members and their guests. Use of the pools is restricted to Resident Members of KCCA who must be 18 years of age or older and their accompanied guests. The number of guests is limited to four (4) per household. Resident Members are responsible for their guests at all times. Guests should be made aware of all pool rules prior to entering the pools.

All entry and exiting of the facility is via a key to the main gate. Keys are not to be loaned or shared for use by anyone other than the Resident Member. If a resident needs an outdoor pool key, they can come to the KCCA Office and pay the \$4.00 deposit to get a key. All Resident Members and their guests must sign in prior to entering the gate.

General Rules:

- THERE IS NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY - USE OF ALL POOL FACILITIES IS AT OWN RISK
- All KCCA pool facilities are non-smoking.
- A cleansing ONSITE shower is required by State Law before entering any pool, even

- if you showered before coming to the facility. A second shower is encouraged after applying lotions or tanning oils.
- Bathing suits are required. No street clothes, cutoffs or street shoes are allowed in pool. Hair restraints are recommended.
- Life-saving equipment is to be used for emergencies only – no playing on ropes or with any life-saving equipment.
- No diving, running, rough play, horseplay or foul language in pool areas.
- No large flotation devices such as rafts or air mattresses are allowed in the pools. Small personal flotation devices are allowed along with aquatic shoes or aquatic socks only.
- No food or beverages (other than water in soft plastic bottles) are allowed in any pool facility.
- No glass or plastic that will shatter is allowed in any pool facility.
- No animals are allowed in KCCA pool facilities.
- No person who is incontinent or who wears diapers or other protection at any time is allowed in any KCCA pool.
- Hard objects used for throwing such as frisbees or other dive and retrieve items are not allowed in any pool facility.
- There is no phone inside the outdoor pool. If there is an emergency, immediately inform a staff person inside the KCCA Pro Shop.
