Get Ready for the Grand Opening of the New Aquatic Center

Construction on our Aquatic Center is 98% complete. We've experienced some delays over the last couple of months due to contract issues and the changing of the Board, but now we're back on track. There are a few remaining items to be completed by the contractor, along with a final cleanup and walkthrough.

Paul Downing is working diligently with the contractor to get the facility open as quickly as possible. The facility is looking fabulous and we're getting excited for the grand opening celebration! While we can't guarantee the opening date, we are aiming for a July 4th opening or shortly thereafter.

As soon as we have a confirmed opening date the process for buying key cards will be announced. There is an initial one-time key card cost of \$5 per member. Replacement costs for a lost or stolen key card is \$15 per member so please keep track of yours.

After construction is completed our KCCA preferred vendor will seal and stripe the parking lot.

The new irrigation lines have been installed and the sprinklers are working. The KCCA staff have been busy cleaning up the flower beds and working with the landscape contractor to bring the landscaping back to life on the back and side of the new building. The back fence has been reinstalled.

Our very own Woodshop Club created our Aquatic Center sign, which will be hung between the front posts of the new building. A big thank you to AI Fredrickson and the members of the woodshop for volunteering their time to construct a wonderful sign for our new facility.

Some of the pool rules to be aware of this year include:

- guests are limited to (4) per household, (instead of (4) per member);
- the indoor pool will be closed between
 9:00 a.m. to Noon, M-F for maintenance;
- swimmies or diapers of any kind are strictly forbidden;
- anyone who normally wears undergarments for incontinence, are strictly forbidden from using the pools or spa;
- a cleansing ONSITE shower is required by State Law before entering any pool or spa, even if you showered before coming to the pool;
- guests under the age of 18 may not use the spa or lap pool; and,
- respect other Resident Members and KCCA Employees, especially when they cite possible rule violations.

Water Aerobics is available at the outdoor pool at 10:00 a.m. and 7:00 p.m. until the indoor pool opens. Indoor water aerobics hours will be 8:00 a.m. and 6:30 p.m. Water aerobics introduced a new routine this year, which seems to be a hit. Join them at the pool and check it out – fun to be had for all! Water aerobics has an annual fee of \$5. For additional information on water aerobics, please contact Donna Lane at 503-719-2996.



Valerie Schuyler with the Pool Fundraising Committee reports a donated fund balance of \$15,806.00 as of 5/20/18. Some of the future purchases might include such things as fire extinguishers, awnings for 14 windows and handheld shower heads. Finally, a huge thank you to all the residents who donated their time and money so willingly to make this facility such a success.

It is our goal to do everything possible to not only secure our pool, but to guarantee its safe and efficient operation in the years ahead. Our new Aquatic Center is going to be 55+community jewel and will serve our community well for years to come.

Outdoor Pool

The KCCA Outdoor Pool is open for the season! Pool hours are 8:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m. or dusk, whichever is earlier. Guests under the age of 18 may use the pool between 11:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m., and 6:00 - 7:00 p.m., and must be accompanied by a resident at all times while inside the outdoor pool enclosure.

Kids at the Pool

If a resident happens to witness a young guest misbehaving at a KCCA pool, they should not confront another resident's grandchildren unless it's a behavior so dangerous the children are in imminent danger of being injured or causing a severe injury. Otherwise, residents should politely discuss behavior issue(s) directly with the children's adult quardian or report the issue immediately to the KCCA Office, if it happens on a weekday. Thank you!

Good Neighbor Corner - Who Should You Call?

Some KCCA residents have called the KCCA Office in recent months for a wide variety of reasons, but many of these calls actually should have been made to other businesses, the City of King City, the police, or a condo association.


To help save time and get residents the assistance or information they might need faster, the focus of this article is about who you can call for what types of inquiries or assistance. This is NOT a complete list of reasons to call different locations or businesses, but more of a general guide.

Call King City – City Hall: 503-639-4082

Residents should call city hall when:

- They have an issue with the street in front of their house or condo, or a parked car parked that has not been moved for more than three days or is blocking their driveway. The City of King City maintains the streets and the KC Police patrol the city streets, not KCCA.
- They need a permit to install or replace things at their home such as a fence, deck, roof, wood stove, siding, etc. Please call the city at 503-639-4082 for a complete list of required permits.
- They receive any correspondence in the mail from the City of King City with this

blue and green logo on it:

Calling for Assistance or Medical Emergency

Calling 911 is the right phone number to call in an emergency when an urgent response is needed.

Examples of when to call 911 include when a fight or an assault is occurring *right now*, a fire is burning, or a medical problem is happening that might be life threatening. While you're on the phone with the 911 call taker, emergency assistance is being dispatched while you're answering their questions. Do not hang up until the call taker ends the call.

What if a resident calls 911 by mistake?

Please stay on the line even if you call 911 by accident, and tell the call taker that everything is OK. If you do not stay on the line they might call back or send a police officer to your home to make sure there is not a problem.

When Should I Call the Non-Emergency Police Number?

Residents can call the nonemergency police phone number 503-629-0111 for non-emergency issues such as:

- Their house or car was broken into yesterday or something was stolen out of their yard in the past few days
- They need to add additional items to a burglary report they made last week
- Their car was stolen sometime overnight
- They have an issue with a neighbor who is harassing them or damaging their property
- They haven't seen their neighbor who lives alone for several days and that's very unusual
- They see a suspicious person lurking in a neighbor's yard or peering into cars or windows

Call Washington County Animal Control: 503-846-7041

Residents should call animal control and not KCCA when:

- They have seen a stray or aggressive dog
- A neighborhood dog is barking incessantly

- Someone has been bitten by a dog that is not theirs
- They have witnessed abuse, neglect, or abandonment of dogs, cats, or other animals
- They have encountered an injured dog or cat

Call Your Condo Association or Management Company

Residents living in condos or townhouses should call their HOA management company or condo/ townhome board president when:

- They have questions about the watering or pruning of the association's outdoor plants and trees
- They need to know where to send their monthly HOA dues payment
- They need to have a repairs done to the exterior of their condo or there is an issue with a tree
- They have questions about insurance for the association or need to get hooked up to cable TV

PLEASE NOTE: KCCA does not handle or monitor any maintenance for condos or townhouses nor does KCCA do any landscaping or watering for condo or townhouse associations. If you aren't sure who your board president is, here's a list:

If a KCCA resident has an issue with their neighbor's yard or fence being out of compliance with the KCCA CC&Rs, they may file a complaint with the KCCA Board of Directors by filling out a complaint form and submitting it to the KCCA Office. The complaint forms are available in the lobby of the KCCA Clubhouse next to the office door.

Seniors: Beware of New Medicare Card Scam

According to a new AARP survey, more than three-quarters of Americans over the age of 65 know little or nothing about the federal government's initiative to replace their Medicare cards over the next year. And that makes these seniors susceptible to scammers intent on taking advantage of the confusion.

In an effort to help protect seniors from identity theft, the federal government recently started mailing new cards that come with a mix of numbers and letters instead of your Social Security number. The cards will be sent automatically to Medicare's roughly 59 million participants over the next year. Seniors should be sure their addresses are up to date with the Social Security Administration. Congress is requiring the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services to remove Social Security numbers from Medicare cards by April 2019. **Scammers Still Hard at Work**

Scammers posing as Medicare representatives have already been calling Medicare card holders demanding a processing fee for these new Medicare cards. Other fraudsters are telling beneficiaries that they are owed a refund from transactions on their old card and then asking for bank account information to process the reimbursement. PLEASE BE AWARE: Medicare will never ask you for a bank account number, and no refunds are owed to anyone.


The new Medicare cards are free. Medicare officials have emphasized that they will never call beneficiaries about their cards. Oregon is one of the first states to receive the new cards. So just hang up on any scammer who tries to get you to give them any money related to a Medicare card.

Water aerobic exercise is a safe, non-weight bearing workout, and especially helpful for seniors with physical issues of arthritis, and other

joint/movement problems. Because water reduces pressure, it lessens stress on bones, joints and muscles while toning, strengthening and burning calories.

Join us for this fun, healthy exercise session

in the KCCA outdoor pool either during weekday mornings or evenings, or both! We follow three different instructional CDs for our exercise routines. Each is about 50 minutes in length. You will need to be patient with yourself because listening to directions takes some concentration and effort, but as soon as you start moving, the physical benefits begin. It is so liberating! The only thing needed to participate is a comfortable swimsuit (one that

stays in place and moves with you).

We are a non-profit organization with a charter and elected officers, with meetings as necessary; usually one annual meeting for elections. We charge

\$5 per year to join, payable with your application for membership. The fee is used to purchase and maintain equipment and for operational costs.

There are two water aerobics sessions every Monday through Friday held in the outdoor pool

during the summer of 2018. The morning session begins at 10:00 a.m. and the evening one starts at 7:00 p.m. If you are eager to try our program, come to any session, and see what we do. For more information, call 503-719-2996.

Tech support scammers often make false claims that they are associated with legitimate computer companies to make you believe them. The person who calls, or the popup window that gives you a toll-free number to call, is from a scammer who wants to steal your money. If you give someone control of your computer, they can install malicious software that can help them steal your personal information. And anyone who asks you to pay for anything – including tech support services – with a gift card is scamming you.

Tech Tip

Be aware that many popups will claim to be from Microsoft or Apple claiming that your computer is infected. Do not call the posted phone number! Simply close your browser and restart your computer. If you know someone

who has fallen for the scam have them contact their credit card company and report the charges as fraudulent.


Zumba Gold Dance Classes for Seniors
