# Water Aerobics Club

If you avoid walking in the rain, hate exercise of any kind but know you need to do something, consider joining the KCCA Water Aerobics Club. Even if you have physical issues like arthritis, diabetes, are overweight or lack energy, make the decision to come to the beautiful new pool and try the perfect exercise for older persons. Movements in the water are so much easier than on land. You can feel better regardless of the weather, you don't have to fight traffic, stand in line or spend a lot of money.

Joining the water aerobics club is not difficult. We have two sessions: 8 am or 6:30 pm every Monday through Friday. All you need is a bathing suit. The difference between the morning and evening sessions is time. Some of us like exercising first thing, others prefer aerobics to relax after a busy day.

To get started, we suggest you just



show up, and tell somebody you are new. Be a few minutes early to orient yourself to the pool, and because we start exactly on time. Remember shower required before entering pool.

Our dues are \$5 per calendar year, but we encourage you to try several sessions before you decide to join. That way you get to learn if our routines are enjoyable and beneficial for you. Our routines are not difficult, but following verbal, physical directions can be disorienting at first. It may take a few tries. You can add intensity at your own pace as you learn and as your body dictates.

A few years ago, I attended a lecture by New York photographer Jay Maisel. This month's photo by club member, Andy Wihtol, reminded me of Maisel's stressing how important gestures are in conveying emotion and telling a story. In his book, *Light, Gesture, and Color*, Maisel writes that "Gesture will survive whatever kind of light you have. Gesture can triumph over anything because of its narrative content." This family photo from Andy's archives beautifully captures the exuberance of his young children sledding down the hill. The look on their faces, his daughter's hair flying in the breeze, and his son's look of uncertainty as they propel down the slopes, takes me back to my own childhood memories of winter adventures.

Think about it. Sometimes it is the simplest gesture or movement that turns a forgettable snapshot into a memorable photograph. One way of discovering this is by taking a series of images in quick succession. It may

be the third or fourth image, instead of the first posed shot that reveals that magic moment of spontaneity.

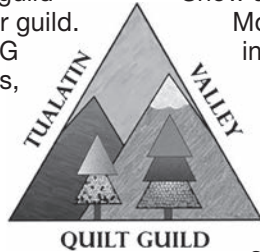

### Portland Art Museum

The Portland Art Museum is the seventh oldest museum in the United States and the oldest on the West Coast. On February 21, 2019 the KC Travel Club will experience The Museum's collection of more than 42,000 objects, displayed in 112,000 square feet of galleries, reflects the history of art from ancient times to today. The collection is distinguished for its holdings of art of the native peoples of North America, English silver, and the graphic arts. An active collecting institution dedicated to preserving great art for the enrichment of future generations, the Museum devotes 90 percent of its gallery space to its permanent collection. 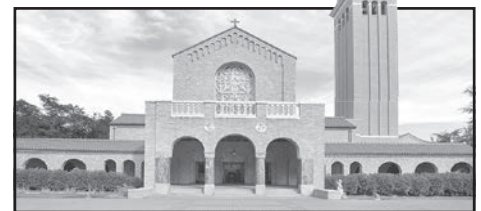
the Clubhouse Office. You must make a reservation BEFORE sending checks. If you have a care person, that person must pay for their space on the trip.

### Benedictine Abbey Mt Angel, OR

The KC Travel Club will travel south to Mt Angel to visit the Benedictine Brewery. The Brewery opened in November 2018. One of only three breweries in the United States owned and operated by monks, this Benedictine craft beer uses locally sourced hops grown on Abbey land and water from the monks' well. These include the Brewery's flagship beer, Black Habit, a dark ale which has received an enthusiastic reception from the brewing community and beer lovers; St. Benedict's Farmhouse Ale, a mildly hoppy brew; and the brand new Helles Lager. Our tour guide will tell us about the process of making beer. Beer will be available to purchase.

The next leg of our trip will be up the hill to the church, museum, bookstore etc. The Mount Angel Abbey Museum is a very eclectic collection put together by the community of Benedictine monks that live and work at the abbey of Mt. Angel, Oregon. But the museum isn't the only reason to visit. Established in 1882



by the Abbey of Engelberg, Switzerland, the abbey is located on the top of a scenic 485-foot high butte. The bulk of the museum is comprised of rocks and minerals, antique liturgical vestments and religious items, American Civil War memorabilia, and, the biggest draw, mounted animal dioramas. The collection of taxidermy features an American Bison

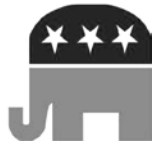
We will have a late lunch at the Glockenspiel Restaurant in the main part of Mt Angel.
