Electing new members to the KCCA Board Of Directors

The terms of three current members of the Board of Directors, Paul Downing, Valerie Schuyler and Carolyn Griffith, will expire after the June election. Three resident-member candidates who receive the most votes in the June election will replace them will serve three-year terms.

All resident-member candidates running for a Board position must complete a Board of Directors Application Packet. The packet asks for a description of skills and experience relevant to Board position, a petition requiring 25-member signatures and a bio and photo. Packets will be available in the office as of **March 20th**.

Nominating Committee will

nominate at least 3 candidates to fill the open board positions. Resident-members may also become candidates for a Board position by picking up a packet in the KCCA office. **Applications for all candidates are due in the KCCA office by April 10th.**

On **April 23rd** the Nominating Committee will announce the names of all resident-member candidates including the names of those nominated by the Committee and others who completed the Board of Directors Application Packet.

Candidates are invited to speak to members at the Annual Membership Meeting on **May 21st**. The election will be held in early in June, date to be announced.

Member Services News

In March we announced the exciting news that the Hello Neighbors Social Committee offered to work with the office to recruit member volunteers for a Clubhouse Information Window; which would enable us to offer services during more hours of the week.

At the March 12th Board of Directors meeting a member suggested creating an "information kiosk" in the Clubhouse lobby, rather than having member volunteers sit at the existing window. Members of the Board would like to consider this further, so we are gathering the information needed for the Board to review viability and cost.

This will delay our announcement of any extended hours. At least two options will be presented to the Board when the new suggestion's information has been compiled.

No matter which direction is taken, we would like to reassure members that volunteers will not have access to confidential financial, member, Board or staff information; this includes KCCA's security and surveillance systems, internal document / file storage, internal email, member files, staff files and Board-only documents or information.

We'd also like to highlight one benefit of the volunteer plan. Right now, conversations at the window are basically "public," that is, anyone in the Clubhouse lobby (or standing in line behind the member talking) overhears the conversations taking place. The presence of member volunteers will enable staff to step-away and talk to members in a closed and more private area, out of earshot of the window and lobby.

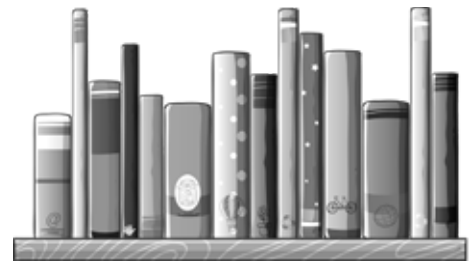

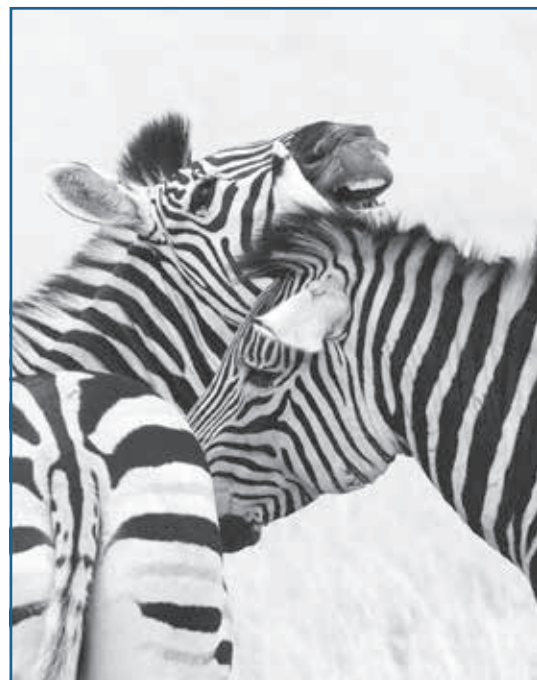

KC Travel Club Trip

Japanese Garden and International Rose Test Gardens – June 21, 2019

On Friday, June 21, 2019 the KC Travel Club will tour the Japanese Gardens and International Rose Test Gardens at Washington Park in NW Portland. The trip will begin with a tour of the Japanese Gardens then a self guided, casual stroll through the Rose Gardens to enjoy the fragrance of the gorgeous flowers.

In 1915 Jesse A. Currey, president of Portland's Rose Society and Sunday editor of the Oregon Journal, convinced city officials to institute a rose test garden to serve as a safe haven during World War I for hybrid roses grown in Europe. Rose lovers feared that these unique plants would be destroyed in the bombings. The Park Bureau approved the idea in 1917 and by early 1918, hybridists from England began to send roses.

Originally, the garden occupied about a block, sandwiched between a playground and an elk corral. A parking lot replaced the original rose garden when the garden moved to its current location in 1928. The garden later expanded in the 1950s when Washington Park's zoo moved to its current location.

The award called Portland's Best Rose was established in 1996. Rose experts from around the world attend a one-day judging in June and select the best rose that day from thousands of submissions. Portland remains the only North American city to issue such an award.

By 2013, the garden's collection had expanded to over 10,000 rose bushes of over 650 varieties.

Nestled in a serene nook of Portland, Oregon's Washington Park sits the beautiful Portland Japanese Garden. Highlights are the Cultural Center, The Gift Shop and the Umami Café. There will be a shuttle from the visitor's center up to the garden entrance.

There are five different gardens within the Portland Japanese Garden: the Sand and Stone Garden, the Strolling Pond, the Natural Garden, the Flat Garden, and the Tea Garden. As with all garden photography, I look for leading lines. These can be found in the many paths throughout the Garden, including the small brooks

in the Natural Garden or near the Strolling Pond. Details are to be found too. Whether it is a grouping of maple leaves or round stones near the Pavilion, this is a great garden to notice the little things.

After visiting the gardens we will head south down I-5 to dine at a Japanese Restaurant in Tualatin.

The cost of the trip will be \$56. This price includes transportation, entry and tour of the Japanese Gardens, lunch and all gratuities. Reservations must be made no later than June 12, 2019. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE MADE AFTER THE DEADLINE DATE.**

To participate in this adventure, you must be a KC Travel Club member with Emergency Contact information on file. Annual dues are \$5 and are to be paid in a separate check from the cost of the trip. The checks are to be placed in the Travel Club slot at the Clubhouse Office. You must make a reservation BEFORE sending checks. If you have a care person, that person must pay for their space on the trip. The bus will leave the KC Library parking lot at 9:30am and return at approximately 4:30pm

A letter to LARC from a KCCA resident:

Submitted by Landscaping, Architectural Review and Compliance (LARC):

A letter to LARC from a KCCA resident:

I planted some grass and a few small trees in my front yard. Now, I've received a notice from LARC for not submitting an architectural application prior to installing new grass and a few small trees in my front yard.

I thought an architectural application was only required if I was doing home improvements to the exterior of my house. Is it typical for our HOA to require an architectural application for landscaping?

— Concerned KCCA resident

Concerned KCCA resident:

The short answer is "Yes." Our association does require homeowners to submit an application to LARC for review and approval prior to permitting a homeowner to commence almost any exterior improvement to their

property, including landscaping.

Under Resolution 2012 - 102:

Landscaping Changes: Require the submission of a written landscape plan for addition, alteration or removal of lawn areas, shrubbery, trees or flowerbeds. Dead trees and vegetation must be removed. A written opinion from an arborist may be required before the removal of a tree. New tree and shrub applications will be considered based on the proposed location, adjacent properties and size at maturity.

APRIL is clean-up month for our KCCA community including, but not limited to, exterior paint condition, moss on roof, fence inspections, light post being upright and in working condition, pruning of trees and shrubs, weed cleanup in yard, driveway, sidewalk, and curb areas. If a resident has any questions or needs forms for HOA landscaping review, please contact the KCCA Clubhouse Office.

There is no question about the fact that those attending the **Grilled Cheese Sandwich Cook-Off** enjoyed yourselves.

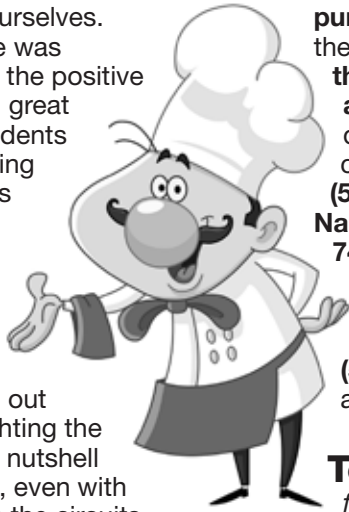
The Committee was wowed with all the positive comments and great feedback. Residents are even throwing their chef's hats in the ring to compete in a possible **follow-up cook-off**.

Tomato Bisque

from Nancy Hayes

1 red pepper, seeded and diced
1 green pepper, seeded and diced
4 stems celery, diced
½ yellow onion, diced
1 tsp. minced garlic
¼ cup butter
1 qt. chicken broth
1 qt. ½ n ½
1 pt. heavy whipping cream
½ cup white wine
salt & pepper
1 pint diced tomatoes
½ cup dried basil or chopped fresh basil

Combine first 6 ingredients in 2 gallon pot; sauté until brown, adding more butter if necessary. Add chicken broth and bring to a boil. Add ½ 'n ½ and whipping cream, and bring to a very low boil. Make a roux; stir into soup until consistency is even throughout. Add wine, salt and pepper to taste. Remove pot from heat and add tomatoes and basil.

NOTE: To reduce calories, make a white sauce using about 1 cup of chicken broth, ¼ cup of butter and the same amount of flour. You can use milk instead of ½ 'n ½. You can eliminate the whipping cream or use some to add richness and body at the end.

Tomato Basil Bisque

from Mary Lou Russ

½ cup onion, finely chopped
4 tablespoons butter
¼ cup plus 1 tablespoon flour
4 cups tomatoes (28 oz. canned)
1 can Mexican recipe stewed tomatoes
1 tablespoon dill weed
1 teaspoon oregano
2 tablespoons dried parsley



2 tablespoons dried basil
3 cups chicken stock
¼ cup honey
1 cup cream
Salt and pepper to taste (about
1/2 tsp salt; 1/4 tsp pepper)

Sauté onions in butter. Add flour, tomatoes, herbs, and chicken stock. Mix well and puree either by pouring into a regular blender and then back in the soup pot or by using an immersion blender. Bring to a boil; then simmer for 15 minutes. Add honey and cream. Heat thoroughly. Add salt and pepper to taste.

Extra Sharp Tillamook cheddar cheese-sliced
Gruyere cheese-sliced
Crisply fried bacon slices
Room temperature butter
Boursin Gournay cheese-Garlic & Fine Herbs

- Mix butter and Boursin (it is soft and creamy like cream cheese).
- Spread butter mixture on outside of bread slices.
- Turn one slice over on top of other slice to expose inside; spread some Boursin on inside of slice.
- Layer cheddar cheese, bacon slices and Gruyere.
- Lift off carefully and lay buttered side in hot pan then place second slice on top with buttered mixture up.
- Press down lightly as cheeses beginning to soften.
- Carefully turn over (use 2 spatulas to hold everything together).
- Cook until both sides are nicely browned and cheese is just beginning to ooze.
