KING CITY VOTES 2019

Your KCCA Election Committee brings you a "What to expect with this year's election"

Since we are contracting with an independent vendor to facilitate our election, you can expect the following events to take place:

May 10, 2019. Your election ballot will be mailed out to you with a return envelope. When you receive your ballot, you may make your selections, put the ballot in the return envelope, **PLACE YOUR STAMP ON THE ENVELOPE**, and put the envelope in the mailbox. The office will not accept ballots, please do not put them in the mail slot in the office. **The office will not accept responsibility for your ballot and mail it for you.**

May 15, 2019. If you wish to vote online, your ballot will have an identification number on it. Log in to the web portal and follow the directions on your ballot for online, (electronic), voting for your selections on a secure website. Please note that this portal opens on May 15, but you may vote electronically until 6 PM on June 4.

May 17, 2019. If you haven't received your ballot, email info@mykcca.com or call 971-236-7270 and leave your name, phone number, and/or email address on the office message line.

May 19, 2019. If you wish to vote online but are not sure how to logon and run the portal, you may bring your ballot and picture ID showing your King City address to the clubhouse and receive assistance from a non-KCCA facilitator, from 1:00 PM to 3:00 PM.

May 21, 2019. If you have no idea whom you wish to vote for, you may attend the members meeting in the clubhouse at 6:30 PM to meet the candidates, hear what they have to say about themselves, and ask

questions of them at that time.

May 24, 2019. If you voted with a paper ballot, you must mail your ballot in on this day if you have not already done so. **Ballots mailed after May 24 will not be counted.**

May 26, 2019. If you are voting online and are still needing assistance to get your vote done, you may attend another online voting assistance session, again from 1:00 PM until 3:00 PM. Bring your ballot and picture ID showing your King City address to the clubhouse.

June 4, 2019. This is election certification day! If you still haven't voted, you may only vote online. If needed, bring your ballot and picture ID showing your King City address to the clubhouse between Noon and 6:00 PM to receive assistance. If you are a new resident and wish to vote, bring your picture ID, email address and a proof of residence (such as a copy of your deed) to the office between 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM. The independent vendor will email you your identification number and you may vote online from that time until 6:00 PM, when the election closes. The independent vendor will count the paper ballot votes and certify the election before June 11. Candidates will be notified of the results prior to June 11.

June 11, 2019. Newly elected board members will be installed at the 6:30 PM Board meeting.

We are excited to venture into this new arena of online voting as the wave of the future. You may rest assured that the results are accurate and have been made free from any undue influences.
