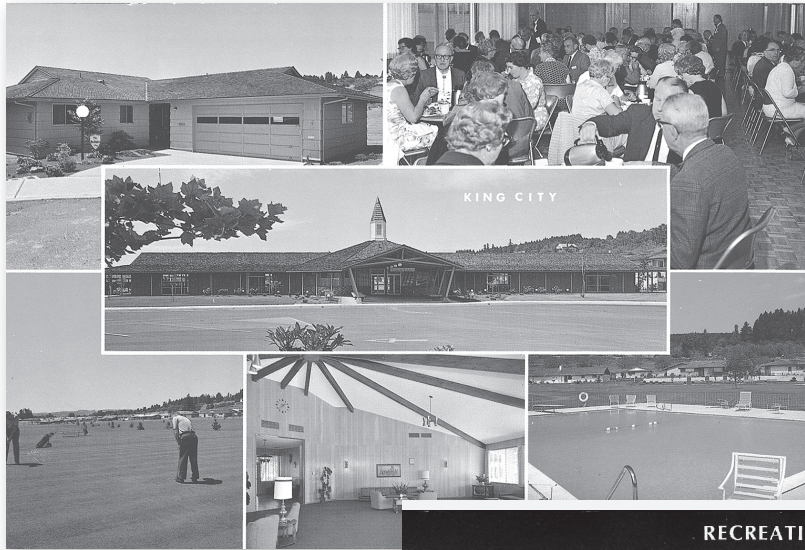

SERVICE FACILITIES



The handsomely designed Town Hall at King City, an outstanding architectural achievement, is the center of services and facilities more varied than a country club. Entering through the beautiful arched entrance you step into a spacious TV and Coffee Lounge, which is an ideal gathering place for residents-owners. You will find individual meeting rooms with kitchen close by for preparing refreshments, pot luck dinners or even full banquets. A 200 seat auditorium, equipped with the latest in sound equipment, is yours for any event of interest to residents. Bordering the Patio and Golf Course is the heated Swimming Pool, offering many hours of enjoyment to all residents and their guests.

King City is adjacent to a new 4-lane highway, with access to regular bus service to all

points. In the final planning stages are a Shopping Center, Restaurant, Convalescent Hospital and Motel.

All utilities are underground, including electric power, telephone, sanitary system, Tigidard water. No additional assessments will be made against residents.

A Medical Plan will be available to all residents of King City. A Residence Maintenance Service will interest those who plan to be away from home over extended periods of time. Electric Carts available for residents.

As needs develop group purchasing will be inaugurated for residents of King City, from drugs delivered to your door, to insurance, from frozen foods, to entertainment tickets that include comfortable transportation.

Arts and Crafts

A fully equipped Arts and Crafts Building houses the equipment and know-how for sewing, ceramics, woodworking, knitting, painting with natural light and ample storage cabinets for equipment.

Swimming

The regulation size heated swimming pool is near the center of activities and is a wonderful place for you and your friends and family to relax. Swimming lessons are available as requested.

King City Civic Association

All King City facilities, with the exception of the Golf Course, will be turned over to the King City Civic Association, a non-profit organization composed of residents and operated by them for the benefit of the entire community. This will include the Town Hall, Arts and Crafts Center, Locker Room and Sauna Baths, Swimming Pool and Shuffleboard Court. Until this transfer is completed, as the city grows and makes this feasible, residents have the use of the general facilities for the nominal charge of \$20.00 per year per person.

Other Activities

Interesting activities for you include Shuffleboard, Croquet, Horseshoes, Putting Green, Archery, Badminton, Chess and Checkers, Bridge and Canasta, Billiards.

Cook-outs and BBQ's are planned especially for the residents of King City and their guests.

Important Message!

There are many areas in our amenity buildings being used to store items that members and clubs frequently use for activities that take place in KCCA. Most are locked by the members / clubs. We believe that some storage areas have been abandoned, however, we have no way of confirming this because we do not know who uses every space.

Your KCCA Election Committee encourages you to vote!

Election Day is June 4th! The ballot mailing deadline has passed, but you still have until 6:00 PM on Tuesday June 4th to vote online.

The online voting site offers all biographical information submitted by the candidates. Please follow the entire link provided in your mailing from the independent vendor to vote.

Since we are contracting with an independent vendor to facilitate our Board of Directors election this year, you can expect the following events to take place:

June 4

If you are a new resident and wish to vote, bring your picture ID, email address, and a proof of residence (such as a copy of your Deed) to the office between 8:00 AM and 10:00 AM. The independent vendor will email you your identification number and you may vote online from that time

until 6:00 PM, when the election closes.

If you are registered, but still haven't voted, bring your ballot and picture ID showing your King City address to the office between Noon and 6:00 PM and you will be assisted in voting online.

After voting closes at 6:00 PM, the independent vendor will count the paper ballot votes and certify the election before June 11. Candidates will be notified of the results prior to June 11.

Newly elected Board members will be installed at the 6:30 PM Board meeting.

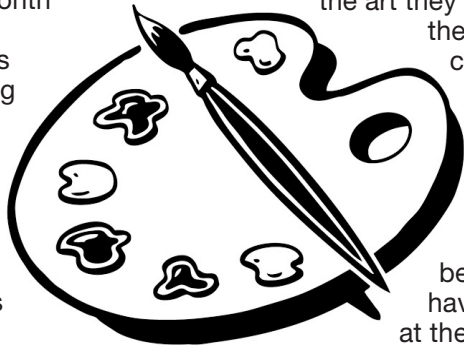
King City Artists' Guild

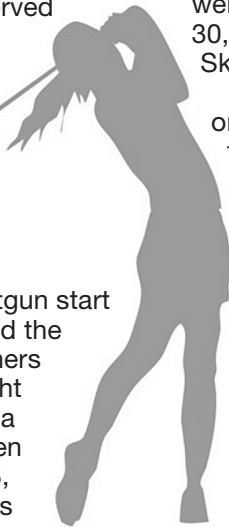

On July 13, 2019, the King City Travel Club will head north to the Mt St. Helen’s National Volcanic Monument. At the Johnston Ridge Visitors Center. 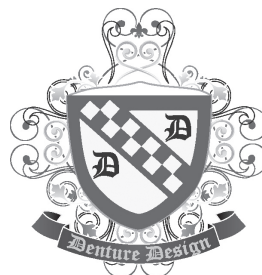
