of both paper ballots and electronic voting. The committee received valuable feedback, creativity shown by some of our electors, both favorable and unfavorable, which will help shape our future elections into an even more seamless process.

A record 49.1% of the eligible voters participated in this election.

862 votes were cast with 859 counted as valid votes. Anomalies included ballots with the ID and PIN numbers cut out of the ballot, thus invalidating them: ballots submitted with more than three selections marked, were also invalidated; in addition, others submitted, but not counted, included candidate information sheets with faces/names circled in lieu of an actual ballot.

Paper ballots submitted numbered 559, with 55 of those ballots making use of the write-in feature. The committee

While there was a confusing instruction regarding the mailing deadline, [Mail by Friday (24), May 28 (Tuesday)], all paper ballots arrived in time to be counted. The remaining 300 votes were submitted electronically.

> The cost of this year's voting process will be reviewed by the finance committee and made a part of that committee's report at the next board meeting.

> The committee recommends continuing the on-line voting process, but begin the voting timeline sooner in order to meet the chain of events already established in the governing documents and past practices, including allowances for party time on the night of the election.







Here are the most recent aquatic center questions:

- Q: Can we get a swimsuit spinner in the locker rooms?
- A: The Pool Committee has done extensive research on the cost and maintenance of a swimsuit spinner (water extractor). Our research shows the life span of spinners are short, especially on the less expensive models. All spinners, or extractors, require weekly inspection and maintenance and if not installed and maintained properly can provide opportunity for slips and falls from the water being extracted onto the floor below the unit if not properly drained. Spinners are not a recommended purchase for our facility.
- Q: Sometimes the jets don't work in the hot tub, why is this happening?
- A: This happens when residents physically turns off one or more of the jet nozzles inside the hot tub. Each jet can be turned back on by turning the jet ring. Stop turning the ring when you first feel resistance. If the ring is turned too far the jet could pop out of the jet housing. If this happens push the jet back in and turn the ring to tighten.

Q: Why does the indoor pool water temperatures fluctuate?

- A: Each of the pools run on their own individual electronic heater systems. Unless the system temperature is manually changed or there is an equipment failure, the set water temperature can't change. However, if maintenance recently added water to the pool or you're swimming near a water intake the water may feel colder until the entire pool rises to the system set temperature.
- Q: If the water temperature never changes then why does the water feel colder sometimes?

- A: Our feeling of "hot" and "cold" have less to do with the absolute temperature and more to do with the effective rate of heat transfer from our skin. It's important to remember that when we "feel" the temperature, we don't actually measure the temperature of what we're touching but the temperature of our skin, which is affected by how well the water conducts heat. Water is a good conductor, which means your body heat will "flow" quickly when you touch the water, that's why it feels cold when you get in and can feel even colder on warmer days when your body heat is even warmer than usual.
- Q: What is the purpose of the red button on the wall in front of the hot tub?
- A: The button is an emergency shutoff for the hot tub. This button is designed for emergency use and should not be used for the sole purpose of turning off the jets to soak in hot water without the jets running.
- Q: I find hair in the drains, why isn't maintenance cleaning up the hair?
- A: Maintenance cleans a lot of hair from the drains every morning; a nasty task that I'm sure none of us would want to be assigned to do. We can all be a part of the solution to reduce the volume of hair in the drains by wearing a swim cap or tying up our hair before entering the pools.
- Q: Recently I've been seeing rubber particles in the pool, what is this from?
- A: The rubber particles appear to be coming from residents wearing rubber sole swim shoes in the pools that may be beyond their life cycle. The rubber particles can be hard on the filter system. Please inspect your swim gear regularly for your protection as well as for our pools.

Q: Why isn't our janitorial service being held to an appropriate standard of cleaning?

A: We are experiencing some staffing issues within KCCA which is impacting the amount of available janitorial labor for the aquatic center, coupled with experiencing unsatisfactory janitorial service from our outside vendor. Recently the Board asked the Pool Committee to research alternative cleaning options. In the meantime, our Maintenance Supervisor and our Administrator are working with the outside vendor to rectify the current janitorial service issues.

- Q: Why do we have standing water in the locker rooms and showers?
- A: While the floors were poured per the construction drawings and the City passed inspection, the floor slopes do not appear to be effective for proper drainage. The Board recently tasked the Pool Committee with researching optional solutions for this issue.
- Q: What's being done about the algae on the locker room & shower floors at the aquatic center?
- A: The Board asked the Pool Committee to research testing to identify the spores so a proper course of action could be taken. At a recent board meeting the Pool Committee advised the Board while testing can identify the type of spores and a proper course of action could be taken to get rid of them the spores will continue to return unless we first focus on the cause of the spores, which may or may not be caused by the standing water due to poor floor drainage. The Board asked the Pool Committee to consult pool experts and report back to the board for resolution.
- Q: Can the indoor pool family hours be changed to include a late day or evening hour similar to the current outdoor pool schedule?
- A: The Pool Committee reached out for community feedback to this request. What feedback we did receive was not in favor of changing the family time hours. More community feedback is needed before recommending a change of hours to the Board.




