KCCA Clubhouse Parking Lot Update

The KCCA Board of Directors voted on July 9, 2019 to open the Clubhouse parking lot for parking, except for the spaces that are marked "No Parking" and blocked with cones. Until work on the ADA parking spaces is completed, please consider dropping off / picking up members or guests who have difficulty with mobility at the front door.

As of the date of this writing (July 12), the plans for completing the parking lot work have been filed. Next, the Board will select a contractor (to complete the additional work required) from proposals being sought by the Administrator. After that work is completed, the sealing and striping of all three parking lots can be done. This work will be staged to keep open space for parking.

Notice of parking lot closures will be posted at the front entrances of the Clubhouse, Arts & Crafts Building and Pro Shop as soon as the contractors schedule their work. Notice, and any new status information, will also be posted in the Announcements on the home page of our web site (mykcca.com).

The committee is also considering how to make forms easier to read and making the process user friendly.



CHECK IT OUT! Library News

Can I use the library outside the librarians' hours? Absolutely! The library, in the Arts and Crafts Building, is private and only for the use of KCCA residents. It is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. We encourage you to visit your library. All you need to enter is the key that allows you to enter the other KCCA facilities (except the Aquatic Center). Keys are available for a nominal charge at KCCA's office.

How can I learn about or check out new books? Each week a list is compiled of newly purchased or donated regular print and large print books. The list is displayed on the front counter for regular print books or near the rear window for large print books.

New books are located in an area adiacent to each list unless they've been checked out. If a book is present, check it out in the usual way. If you want to reserve a new book in either area sign up at the

front counter for the book you want to read. A volunteer will record your request and notify you in turn by phone when the book is available.

An example would be Della Owens' Where the Crawdads Sing. It has been on the New York Times best selling list for 44 weeks. We have it! You just have to sign up and wait your turn.

Did anyone finish the "stamps" jigsaw puzzle? Yes!! Thank goodness!!! It was a horribly difficult puzzle with no edge pieces, and with many repetitions, and

a few extra pieces. I don't know the names of the heroes who completed that one, but I surely admire them!



Why am I required to shower before entering the pool, even if I showered before leaving home?

Showering before entering the pool is one of the least practiced habits before swimming in most countries around the world. In many ways it is understandable. After all, you are about to jump into a pool. What is the point of taking a shower first? What's the harm?

On July 1, 2019 the CDC published a new warning about the rise in fecal parasites found in swimming pools, caused by improper showering or lack of showering before entering a pool. The warning came from the CDC's recent Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report, which highlighted a 13% increase in cryptosporidiosis (Crypto) outbreaks each year from 2009 to 2017. In about 35% of the outbreaks, sicknesses were linked to swimming pools and playgrounds. Public health experts say that even trace amounts of infected fecal matter on hands or swimsuits can contaminate swimming pools - and others who ingest it can become infected as well.



Unlike many other microscopic organisms that can be killed by a pool's chlorine or other chemicals, crypto can tread water for a long time. Crypto is special, it has an

outer shell which makes it resistant to chlorine and heat, and so Crypto parasite can live for more than a week in most pools. The CDC says ingesting the parasite can cause "profuse, watery diarrhea for as long as three weeks." According to the CDC, young children, pregnant women and those with weakened immune systems are most likely to become ill when infected with Crypto.

I sympathize with swimmers who don't understand the reasoning behind the Oregon Health Authority shower requirement as their message is a bit unclear because it just says "shower your child and yourself. Take a cleansing shower before entering the pool or after using the toilet." Perhaps their message would be clearer if it said, "thoroughly shower with soap" because that's what's needed to get rid of Crypto. A thorough shower with soap helps remove perspiration, body oils, cosmetics and traces of urine and fecal matter on the body. Sending those substances down the shower drain goes a long way toward reducing the "yuck factor" for everyone who shares the pool, but there is much more to consider.

When swimmers shower away impurities, they help reduce the risk of waterborne illnesses, such as diarrhea, swimmer's ear and skin infections. Fecal matter, in particular, contains germs that may be ingested when swimmers swallow contaminated water. Chlorine and other swimming pool disinfectants help protect swimmers from waterborne germs, but germ destruction is not instantaneous.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) urges people to shower with soap before swimming as

part of Three Steps for All Swimmers to Protect Against Recreational Water Illnesses. Yet, their survey found 44 percent of people do not believe it is necessary to shower before going in the pool. Only 32 percent of respondents surveyed say they always

shower before swimming.

The CDC recommends following these 4 easy steps to help keep germs out of the water and stay healthy:

- Stay out of the water if you have diarrhea
- 2. Take a cleansing shower with soap before you get into the water
- 3. Don't release urine or fecal matter in the water
- 4. Don't swallow the water

The KCCA supports healthy pool water for all residents by including the following additional requirements:

- No person who is incontinent or wears diapers or other protection at any time is allowed in any pool or spa. Swimmies, diapers or other protection options are strictly forbidden in the pools. To clarify this rule further this means no person who normally wears diapers is allowed in the pools, even if the diaper is removed
- No person who has had diarrhea in the past two weeks should enter the pools
- A cleansing ONSITE shower is required, even if you showered at home before coming to the pool

According to the CDC survey, 95% of the public believe swimmers have an important role to play in maintaining a healthy pool. That's positive news.

The next step swimmers can take to help achieve healthier pools for our community is one that takes them into the shower for an ONSITE thorough soap cleansing pre-swim shower.
