To create a secure and safe building culture for all residents each of us needs to be vigilant regarding access when entering and exiting the Aquatic Center. Tailgating is one of the most common security breaches. It starts out innocently - a resident opening a door and holding it open for others whom we assume has a key card, allowing other residents to enter who forgot their key card, giving access to someone whose key card isn't working or perhaps providing access to someone who says they are a new resident but hasn't purchased their key card yet, giving your key card to family members, roommate or spouse for use of the facility without the key card owner being present. (each HOA member is required to purchase their own key card)

Recently HOA members have been approached by neighbors from within the surrounding City of King

City who think since they live in King City that our facility is open to them and have been asking members to provide them access as they are entering or exiting the building.

The most common security misstep we see is the passive acceptance of a familiar resident and we open the door for them. Maybe they lived here last week or last month or even yesterday, but maybe they don't live here today. As residents we have no way of knowing if the familiar face is still an active paying HOA member; we don't have any way of physically identifying who should have access to our facility unless they have a working key card.

Safety aside, we are required to pay HOA fees for maintenance of our amenities so why would we want to give unauthorized users' access for free?

The problem with these lax situations, in terms of safety, is that it opens the facility to unauthorized individuals who we don't know are in the building, potentially exposing others to unknown and unexpected harm.

If you're uncomfortable with someone trying to gain access to the facility, please advise them to go to the Club House office, or call a pool marshal for assistance, or suggest they call a pool marshal for assistance. The Club House & pool marshal phone numbers are posted on the outside bulletin board to the left of the front door of the Aquatic Center.

## KCCA Room Rental FAQs (Part 2)

Your Clubs & Amenities Committee thought it would be a good idea to review some of the questions and comments that often come up around room rentals. Feel free to contact us if you have further questions.

#### What should I do when we run out of paper products during our event? What should I do when the tables/ chairs/etc. that were in the room at the time I rented it aren't in the room at the time of my event?

When we rent a room for an event, we can count on the room being there, but we really shouldn't count on anything else! Chairs and tables are often moved from room to room for various clubs, meetings, and events. Paper products are stocked on Fridays but not restocked until Monday. And little gremlins often make off with things that you'd expect to be in a cabinet or drawer.  $\textcircledinitial$ 

Basically, the room will probably be stocked with what we need, but if it's *critical* that certain supplies are there, or it's *imperative* that a certain number of chairs be present, or something else along those lines, it's safest to bring those critical items ourselves.

#### Can I prop the front doors open or use the fire doors to enter/exit during my event?

No, for a variety of reasons. Propping open doors can mess with the heating and cooling, and propping open *fire* doors can lead to a fire spreading faster. Also, an open door might encourage people who aren't residents to wander in, which we generally don't want.

#### Why can't I hold a reservation without paying it?

If we don't have to put money down to reserve a room, it's easier to forget to follow through and actually rent it. Then, a room that could have been rented by someone else sits unused. Even worse, someone who might have wanted to rent that room doesn't get to because it was reserved. It's just best to pay for the room when we reserve it, and get a refund as needed.

#### Can I rent the parking lot?

No, the logistics of that are just too difficult. There's so much activity in the parking lot – club members coming for meetings, residents coming to the office for questions, to the library for books, etc., members of the public coming for golf. It would inconvenience so many people. Also, we're not really equipped to effectively cordon off a part of the parking lot and make sure it isn't used.

## How will my guests access the pool? How will my guests access the exercise room?

THEY WON'T!! The pools and exercise room aren't for rent. When we rent the Crown Center, what we actually rent is the Crown Center **Crown Room** – the pool and the exercise room are never included in the rental.

## Who will help me set up tables and chairs for my event?

KCCA staff aren't available to help you set up for your event. So, most of the time, we'll need to have family or friends or, if appropriate, the people attending our event help with set up. There are also services like Task Rabbit that provide people to help, usually at pretty good rates.

#### How early can I or my caterer arrive to set up? How late can I or my caterer stay to clean up?

When we rent a room, the time *includes* the time necessary for set up and clean up. For example, if the event starts at 7pm, and set up will take an hour, then the rental needs to start at 6pm.

#### If I rent the living room, do I have access to the patio, too? If I rent the banquet room, do I have access to the patio, too?

In the rental form that's in use for the rest of 2019, this isn't spelled out. In in general, we should assume that we've only rented the specific room paid for, and that nothing extra is included. For example, if it's the living room that's rented, we can assume that it's only the living room.

Starting in 2020, though, we'll have explicit pricing for add-ons like the patio! So, we'll be able to specify that we want to rent the living room and the patio, or the banquet room and the patio. We won't, however, be able to rent the patio by itself, because you have to go through the living room or banquet room to get to it.

#### Who will show us where everything is before the event? How do I lock / unlock the doors? Should I turn off the lights? What kind of clean up do I need to do?

Right now, the office staff do their best to provide this information. Also, there are instructions on the back of the reservation form and signs posted at the front doors with pictures.

We're also testing a pilot program where resident volunteers help renters with precisely these kinds of things. The Clubs & Amenities committee members are serving as the first volunteers, through November and December. Then, if the pilot program works well, we'll try to expand for 2020. Stay tuned!

## What should I do when the room is too hot / too cold?

Members can override the thermostats, but for now the staff asks that we refrain from doing this, as people often forget to put it back where it was, and then we have excessive heat or AC running until the next time the staff are in.

When our pilot program is running, though, resident volunteers will help renters make sure the room is back in proper order at the end of an event, including putting the thermostats back where they belong.

## Who can I contact if something happens during my event?

For now, contact the office during office hours. During non-office hours, you can try to reach a board member, though that isn't always possible. If it's serious, contact the King City Police Non-Emergency number: 503-629-0111. If it's an emergency, **call 911**.

When the pilot program is running, you should be able to contact a resident volunteer.
