As always, during the holidays we encourage you to focus on what really matters in your life. The gifts,


parties and sparkly bobbles are wonderful, but take the time to enjoy your family and think about those in our community that could use a little extra care and love this holiday season.

The Board of Directors announced the 2020 Assessment amount on November 12th of \$488 per resident.

The Board approved the 2020 Operating and Reserve Budgets on

November 12th. Assessment invoices will be mailed by November 30th to each residence, in a yellow packet that also contains the Board approved 2020 Budgets and a list of event room rental and golf fees.

If you have not received a bright yellow assessment packet, you may print a copy from the *Announcements* section on the new home page of our website at <u>www.mykcca.com</u>. Copies (white paper) are also available in the Clubhouse lobby sorter, to the right if facing the Member Services Window / Office door. Please note we are unable to restock the sorter during evenings and weekends.

This year online payment options are available for all credit, debit or bank account payments (aka "ACH," using information from your paper checks). The link to pay online is also on our website home page under *Announcements*. The office accepts personal or cashier's checks by mail, in-person or through the mail slot in the locked office door. Payments were due by January 31st. Thank you!

Requests for Age Verification

Members frequently wonder why we ask residents to verify their age, when most members provide proof of age upon first moving to KCCA.

A simplistic explanation is that HUD's Fair Housing Act (FHA) prohibits housing discrimination based on multiple statuses, one of which is age. To allow for senior housing communities, HUD created an exemption called the Housing for Older Persons Act (HOPA).

HOPA-qualified communities must comply with HUD's requirements, one of which is resident age verification. Residents must provide proof of age at least every two years. This can be done using various forms of acceptable ID or by resident signed "self-certification" (avoiding the need for an inperson visit to the office).

Failure to survey residents could jeopardize KCCA's status as a 55+ community.

Why do we ask twice a year? The primary reason is that many residents do not respond the first time, or often the second. Another is how frequently we gain new residents who are not owners.

To be on the safest side possible, we add an age certification to the two major requests for information that we send to all residents annually. In doing this, we feel more assured that we will have the necessary certification from all residents within a two-year period. We are asked throughout the year, generally by lenders, to certify in writing that we can provide documentation that verifies the age of all of our residents. Please help us ensure that we can do this, and maintain our HOPA qualification, by responding. Thank you!

The Aquatic Center is undergoing its one-year building envelope inspection. Building envelope inspections are useful in the fact that they identify areas of moisture intrusion, which can lead to larger problems such as rot in the structure. These inspections often reveal structural problems that need immediate correction for the structural integrity of the building and the safety of its occupants. Other times, the building envelope inspections reveal smaller building envelope defects that can be corrected prior to larger problems developing.

Technically, the inspection will cover everything that separates and protects indoors from out, which includes, but not limited to, exterior walls and siding, roofing, foundations, windows and doors. These elements are exposed and need proper maintenance, materials, and construction to continue to function effectively. As these systems age it is normal to have problems such as roof leaks or cracked siding. However, if issues and/or maintenance is ignored, small problems can lead to very costly ones, and it is always in the HOA's best interest to find them and fix them as quickly as possible.

A building envelope investigation can be as simple as a visual inspection of the exterior of a building or can be more comprehensive. When visual inspections reveal symptoms of a bigger problem and/or if we have reason to suspect a problem may exist, having a comprehensive building envelope inspection is in the HOA's best interest.

Building exteriors should be visually inspected at a minimum of every five years. While these inspections might seem over the top to some, they are intended to protect those who use the facility and the building owner (us) of potential future costly repairs that may be avoidable.

Who do I call if I need assistance while at the pools?

For emergencies call 911 If you need assistance with safety, injury, maintenance, key card issues, or pool rule infractions, please call the KCCA Club House office for assistance. Do not leave a voice mail concerning safety or injury.

If unable to reach KCCA staff during regular working hours or during staff off hours, call a pool marshal. Contact information is posted at both pools.

The Marshals are the KCCA Pool ambassadors who have a friendly outgoing attitude and encourage residents to have a great time while overseeing pool safety. Pool Marshals are available to assist residents with pool rule questions and enforcement as well as emergency facility closures.

King City Camera Club: 'What's the Story?'

Michael Anderson has been working for years on perfecting exceptional black and white fine art photos. Like many of his images, this shot that he calls, "Acoma Pueblo Ladder," begs the question, "What's the story behind this picture?" To find out more, you can "Google" the history of the Acoma Pueblo," but here are the Cliff notes.

The "Sky City" of the Acoma Pueblo Native Americans is located about 60 miles SW of Albuquerque, NM. According to their Cultural Center website, "The Acoma Pueblo is built atop a sheer-walled, 367-foot sandstone bluff in a valley studded with sacred, towering monoliths. Since 1150 A.D., Acoma Pueblo has earned the reputation as the oldest continuously inhabited community in North America..." Featured in Michael's picture is the traditional wooden ladder that leads to the second story entrance of a Kiva, a religious contemplation chamber.

Chris Balmer, the keynote speaker at the November 2 Nature Photographers of the Pacific Northwest (NPPNW) conference* recommended that photographers ask themselves four questions before shooting: (1) Why is that photo important to you in that moment? (2) What is dominant? (3) Why does it matter? (4) What distracts from it? To that list he added, "does your image have a clear message?" I believe that Michael considered all of those questions as he composed and edited this outstanding image.

Gentle Yoga for Seniors 55+

Ready or not, the holiday season is upon us. As we engage this time of year, whether by embracing it, ignoring it or any point in between, it's here. Finding our way into a calming yoga practice might just smooth our transition through the next month. If nothing else, simply remembering to consciously breath can offer us more ease and presence.

Try this practice: Sama Vritti Pranayama, aka foursquare or equal breathing. This is excellent when feeling harried, stressed or disconnected.

- 1. Breathe in for a four count.
- 2. Pause and hold the breath for a four count.
- 3. Breathe out for a four count.
- 4. Pause empty of breath for a four count.

Repeat the pattern for a minute or two. That's it. It doesn't matter how long you hold your breath. So be gentle with yourself. This practice reduces stress and invokes a calm response. You may have done it in a yoga class or at the Hospital.

If we engage these days with that breath practice, we might feel more peace, ease and holiday cheer.

I hope to see you on the mat.


