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Budget 2021 Assessments and COVID-19



From the Treasurer and Budget Committee

KCCA has temporarily closed common facilities such as clubhouses, access to the proshop, the aquatic center and outdoor pool in response to Covid-19 and social distancing guidelines.

Experts tell us that social distancing will be with us for a while longer, which impacts the extent to which residents will be able to use common facilities. Even as KCCA considers the start to reopen these non-essential facilities, social distancing and space constraints will result in more limited use than in past years. Closed facilities or limited access to facilities do not automatically translate into reduced costs to the association. Rather, KCCA has lost anticipated revenue from golf revenue to clubhouse rentals and does have additional cleaning costs more than those already planned.

Our homeowner's association has the authority to manage, control and operate the common elements, which includes the authority to temporarily close facilities when appropriate. The Covid-19 pandemic does not alter the Board's fiduciary responsibility to meet the Association's financial obligations and does not alter an owner's obligation to pay the assessments levied according to the association's budget.

Thus begins the start of the Budget 2021 season after this extremely unusual year of 2020. The Board will be communicating to residents the "why" behind assessments, from funding maintenance to capital improvements, which help enhance and increase property values. Resident Member Spotlight: Jerry Larson

KCCA **MUSIC CLUB CHORUS** PORTRAIT

This article begins a series of articles that will introduce one of the talented members of our KCCA Chorus. Each chorus member has their own interesting story, including even some professional musical experience. The chorus performs every month, on the first Monday of the month, in the KCCA clubhouse.

This month's portrait introduces Jerry Larsen, one of the group's co-directors. Jerry and his wife Jan have lived in King City for four years, where Jerry has continued his musical pursuits. The move to King City was their fifteenth move in 57 years of marriage.

Jerry began his musical odyssey at age 5, when he began piano lessons while living in North Portland. He took up the bassoon in the 7th grade. As a sophomore at Jefferson High School, he was accepted into the Portland Junior Symphony. For two seasons, he was the principal bassoonist in PJS. Meanwhile, he sang in the Jefferson Senior Choir, and was in the 16-member jazz choir. He earned a little money playing in pit orchestras, for such productions as "South Pacific" and "Die Fledermaus." He was in the chorus for a professional production of "Aida."

Following high school, he joined the Navy, and during his four years at the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, he sang in the Glee Club, and appeared in several TV shows (Ed Sullivan, Pat Boone and Burl Ives) and was an official escort at the Miss America Pageant in Atlantic City for four days. After graduating in 1962 and receiving a commission, he bought a guitar that he could have aboard ship and taught himself to play. In later years, when he and Jan belonged to a "Good Sam" RV camping group, many enjoyable evenings were had sitting around the fire and playing and singing with their group.

In 1967, he joined Pacific Northwest Bell/AT&T as a manager and began a series of "corporate gypsy" moves. He was unable to participate in any musical groups until retiring in 1989, when they moved back to Tualatin. He worked for the State of Oregon until 1998, when he retired again. In the period since, he has sund with the Tigard Pops Chorus, the Conchords, and most recently, the Sherwood Chorale. He had many performances as a soloist with each of these groups. In 1973. when moving back to Portland from New Jersey (job-related with AT&T) he purchased a beautiful 6' Kawai grand piano, and resumed his keyboard playing. This had to be sold when moving to King City, and now a digital keyboard

has to suffice.

Jerry has thoroughly enjoyed his time with the Music Club Chorus, and as co-director. selecting the music, setting up the audio equipment, but

mostly singing. His bass-baritone voice has been heard many times by members who attend the performances. His preferences include Broadway show tunes, folk, country/western, and ballads, mainly "oldies." He also has been active in the Association. currently serving on the Finance and Budget Committees, having served on other HOA boards, mainly in a financial capacity, in the past.

As with the other chorus members, he anxiously awaits the time that the chorus can resume its rehearsals and concerts, once the Coronavirus situation has been conquered.

Lawn Sign Etiquette

It's election season, and the political signs are going up, so this seems as good a time as any to review KCCA's rules about lawn signs. These rules are laid out in our CC&Rs (Article VII, Section 4) and allow for no more than 2 signs per lot, no more than 4 feet square in surface area, extending no more than 3 feet above the ground.

Crucially, the kinds of signs that are allowed are limited to the following:

- **Political signs** allowed for a maximum of 60 days around an election; must be removed within 7 days of the election.
- For sale signs must be removed no later than the closing of the house sale.
- Yard/estate sale signs allowed

for a maximum of 72 hours.

Now, at this point you might be saying "Wait, that's all? Aren't there tons of other signs around KCCA?" And yes, there are - but there shouldn't be.

For a variety of reasons, many exceptions have been made to these rules, either officially by people being granted exceptions, or unofficially by people ignoring the rules. Unfortunately, all the exceptions make enforcement difficult - people say, "How come I can't have a sign, but so-and-so can?" - and they have a point!

The LARC committee, then, has decided to go back to basics and only allow the signs listed above, with one exception (described below). We want to give everyone (including some members of the LARC committee!) some time to get their signs down. So, starting 7 days after the November 3 election, we'll start sending violation letters for signs that don't meet the above criteria.

The exception we'll make is for signs that people put out for roofers, house painters, etc, after they've had work done on their house. We recognize that people get discounts for displaying these signs, and that it might be a hardship to simply disallow them. Luckily, the rules do allow for exceptions with prior written approval from the board. So, if you're having a project done and wish to display a sign to get a discount, please include the type of sign and the amount of time you'll display it with your Project Request Form.
