Please do not return forms with "same as last year" or "already submitted." *Only 2019 form information will be published in the Directory.*

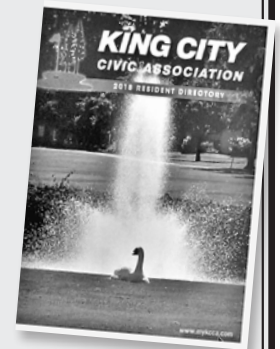
We understand completing forms is not at the top of most people's list of fun things to do. We apologize if you were recently asked to complete a form and are now completing another. This process is one that will be improved on.

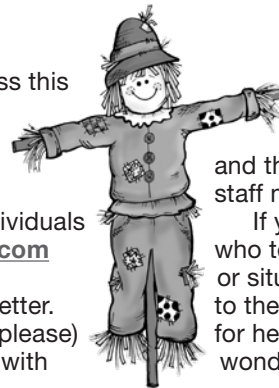
Important Reminder to Members

Therefore, we are unable to answer questions that relate to anything that has been posted on Nextdoor. Similarly, we do not monitor or respond to postings on Nextdoor.

Related to our community, I feel it is important to point-out that we are a community. Some of the newcomers are struggling to feel that, for many reasons, and it frankly makes me a bit sad. While we work out the kinks caused by the long-term absence of an administrator, please keep in mind that everyone involved in running KCCA is doing their best they can with what they have to work with; and, please, give the people in our community the benefit of the doubt when judging their intentions.

King City Travel Club – Mill Casino & Shore Acres in Coos Bay - Dec. 6-8

The King City Travel Club will visit Alpenrose Dairy Farm on November 15, 2018 to attend the Alpenrose Senior Theater's presentation of "T'was The Daze Before Christmas."

Alpenrose is a place for families of all ages. The history of Alpenrose Dairy dates back to 1891 when Swiss born Florian Cadonau, began delivering milk in three-gallon cans by horse-drawn wagon from their dairy farm in southwest Portland to customers throughout the city.

In 1916, it officially became a family business when Florian's son, Henry Cadonau and his wife Rosina took ownership and named it Alpenrose Dairy. The Cadonau's chose the name Alpenrose after the Switzerland national flower, as a tribute to Florian and their Swiss ancestry. In 1962, Alpenrose sponsored its first ever Easter Egg Hunt, inviting the whole community to take part as a way of thanking them for their support. The dairy is also home to Alpenrose Field, where the Girls' Little League Softball World Series has been held since 1993. Under Carl's supervision the dairy processing facility moved, giving way to an ever-expanding campus. A Velodrome bicycle racing track, Quarter Midget Race Car track, western-town Dairyville and Storybook Lane, were all constructed as the former dairy became a hub for community events.

Come join the KC Travel Club to celebrate the beginning of the Holiday Season. Wear your Christmas attire and prepare yourself for some music, fun and laughter.

After the performance we will gather at Gustav's German Restaurant for a tasty German meal. You will be asked to choose from either a Bier

King City Travel Club – Mill Casino and Shore Acres in Coos Bay – December 6-8, 2018

The end of the year trip for the King City Travel Club will be a fun filled two nights and three days in Coos Bay and the surrounding area. We will begin our holiday trip by traveling along the Oregon Coast to Coos Bay. Our destination will be the Mill Casino. During this trip we will travel south to Eugene where we will stop for a rest break; then west to Old Town Florence

for lunch and some shopping. We will continue onward further south on Hwy 101 to our destination. During our time in the area there will be various sightseeing adventures, such as a trip to Old Town Bandon further south on Hwy 101. The highlight of our trip will be on the second night when we will board the bus for Shore Acres State Park to walk through the gardens decorated for the Holidays. The 32nd annual Holiday Lights at Shore Acres is "a community tradition" that began in 1987 with only 6000 lights. The gardens to date are decorated with at least 325,000 lights with the biggest percent being L.E.D. lights.

While in Coos Bay, you will have the option to take the Hotel Shuttle into town if you prefer not to join the group for sightseeing. On the trip home the bus will take us to The Gateway Mall in Springfield for shopping and eats.

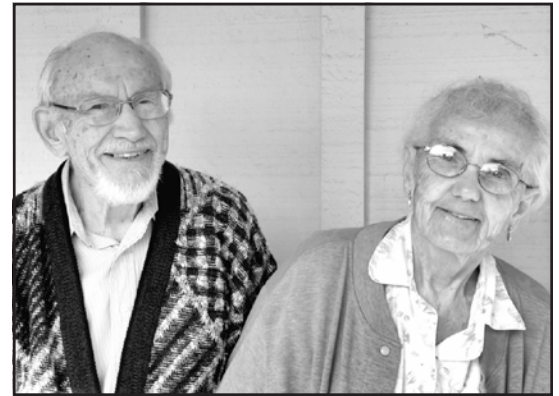

Beth's eyes sparkle when she describes their joy when new space was provided to house the expanding KCCA library and the pride she now feels at how it has grown from such a humble beginning. Unfortunately, recently Bert's failing health has prevented him from serving the library.

Beth recognizes the additions and contributions of each volunteer library leader and the many volunteer staff members who've served the community over the years. The interests and needs of KCCA readers have always been considered. She is so proud of what KCCA's library has become. Beth especially wanted to highlight the existence of the huge section of LARGE PRINT BOOKS of all genres available to KCCA patrons.

Beth's responsibility at the library includes the revue of books relating to health issues. This is appropriate as Beth and Bert are both physicians.

Beth called Pennsylvania home and Bert was raised in Tennessee. They met in Chicago as medical interns at Presbyterian Hospital. They married and practiced in Kentucky where their daughter was born. Then they moved to Mt. Angel, Oregon where Bert practiced internal medicine and Beth taught at the nursing school which was located there at the time. Their son was born while they lived in Mt. Angel. They served that community for more than a decade.

Contact with a visiting physician convinced them they should augment the medical team of a mission in Borneo, the largest island in Indonesia. At that time the government of Borneo had outlawed headhunting, but the practice still occurred. Even so, Beth and Bert accompanied

missionaries into the field to care for the physical needs of the people living in primitive areas. With other medical personnel they established a school of nursing to educate Borneo natives to serve the medical needs of the population. 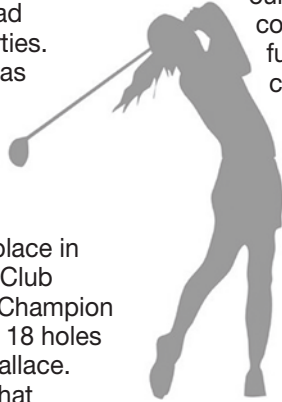
