


Changing of the Guard




"Love In Bloom!" This is the theme of our February concert - how appropriate, leading in to our Valentine's Day observances.

Indoor Pool Update

As you know, our indoor pool is still closed and the construction defect litigation continues. Recently, the board met with our attorney and the engineering experts who are helping us with our case. Some of the things we discussed were around what we can do to re-open the pool while the litigation is ongoing.

There are many things to consider about this, and many decisions we will need to make. First, though, there are two specific hurdles we need to overcome. One, we are still waiting for some parts that we need. Thankfully, the heater we were waiting for has come in and been installed. But, we're still waiting for some parts that are necessary for the monitoring of the chemicals. And, sadly, these parts are caught up in the supply chain woes that are affecting so many - which means we don't have a firm date for when they'll arrive.

And two, the dehumidifier system has something wrong with it that's causing it to throw errors and then shut down. Jeff, our maintenance supervisor, is coordinating with the engineering expert and the dehumidifier company to troubleshoot this issue.

Once these two issues are resolved, we'll be that much closer to re-opening the pool. Please note, though, these are just two of the issues affecting our ability to safely re-open.



Let's talk Safety

Alert your family first if you're in a crash: The 2021 Oregon Legislature, under House Bill 3125, created an emergency contact service for Oregon residents. Starting Jan. 3, 2022, you can register up to two people, age 18 and older, as emergency contacts for situations where you can't communicate.

Only Oregon law enforcement personnel will be able to access your emergency contact information. They are able to do so securely through their patrol cars so they can contact your loved ones quickly.

To register, go to <u>DMV2U.Oregon.gov</u> and sign in to "Access My DMV Profile." You need to have an Oregon driver license, permit or identification card to register with the service.

Ask your family and friends to register their emergency contacts too!

New service will help deaf, hard-ofhearing Oregonians in traffic stops:

For deaf or hard-of-hearing drivers, being pulled over by police can cause more anxiety than just getting a ticket.

Oregonians can now add an indicator that they are deaf or hard of hearing to their vehicle registration, driver license, permit or ID card through **DMV2U.Oregon.gov**.

The option places an indicator on their record, allowing Oregon officers to see the indicator from their patrol vehicles when they run the license plate or license number.

over six years to send veterans to Washington DC to see the memorial built in their honor. The program has been put on hold for the past two years due to the Pandemic. During this two year period the funds have been used for donations to the St. Anthony Food Pantry, the Bethleham Food Pantry and the Metzer School weekend backpack food program for low income families. How To Start A New KCCA Club

Do you have an interest or hobby such as chess, gardening, cooking, etc., that you would like to share with others? If so, you might want to start a club at KCCA. - Pick up and fill out an Annual Club Registration form at the KCCA office.
 - a. Note that the contact person for the club must be a KCCA member, though people from outside KCCA can join the club.
 - b. Look at the calendar in the most recent KCCA newsletter and find a day(s) and start/finish times you can use space at KCCA to meet. Please know that while current club start times are shown, ending times are not, so you should ask at the office if the day(s) and start-

finish times you want are available.

- c. Talk to friends/other members to see if there are enough people interested in the activity you have in mind to form a club. You may want to put a short article in the KCCA newsletter. Include the established day(s) and start/finish times for the club and your name and contact information (phone/email address) so interested folks can reach you. Send your article to office@kccahoa. com no later than the 15th of the month for inclusion in the following month's newsletter.
- d. Be aware that each club is self-governing, responsible for establishing their club's rules, for setting up and taking down tables, chairs and any other equipment you need to use and for leaving the space clean. If there is a fee for materials or instructors, the club contact person is responsible for collecting the fees and disbursing the money.
- e. Once your club has convened, get from the

office the sheet on which you can fill out the names and emergency contacts for people who attend club meetings. Occasionally things happen that require that someone close to us be notified.

- f. Though rare, a special event may be scheduled that conflicts with the space and time you have reserved. You should be notified sufficiently in advance to cancel your meeting.
- g. You will be asked to complete a Club Registration form every year, so keep a copy for yourself for reference!
- Once you have determined a day(s) & times for your new club, turn in the completed form at the KCCA office. Your club will appear in the calendar of the next newsletter if you have met the deadline of the 15th of the month. Have fun!
