Let's Talk Management

Catherine Lee, President - KCCA Board of Directors

There is much debate about who we should hire to assist the Board of Director's in the management of KCCA. One thing I think we all agree on, we need someone, a person (Administrator) or company (Community Management Association), or some combination of both (Hybrid). I personally believe the stakes are too high to not include a company - professionals with more experience and resources who do this for a living - as part of the solution.

We pay for doctors and nurses to help us with our health. We hire teachers to educate our children, firefighters and police to protect us, attorneys and accountants to advise us. Each has experience, education and training to do the job we cannot, and probably should not, do ourselves. Some of us may not be able to afford all these professionals. But in the case of this association, we can't afford not to hire them.

It is not a given that hiring a company, versus one person, costs more. While this might have been true pre-COVID, it appears the scales are tipping. The concept of supply and demand is in full play. The number of available Administrators (Supply) has decreased and what we must pay them (Demand), has increased, especially for people with the qualifications we need. A company can bring us economies of scale by spreading out the costs and tapping into a variety of internal resources to cover the job.

My personal experience at the helm, while also filling in for the administrative management is:

- This is too big a job for one person.
- A board and committees of volunteers, no matter how wellintentioned or experienced cannot, and should not, do this administration management job.

This is why our governing documents give the Board the power to hire the help needed to run KCCA successfully.

- Neither one person, nor one group of people, nor any one company, nor any Board will ever be successful if they are under constant attack, the subject of rumors, character assassination and under a microscope of people looking for every little flaw. That is tearing down. We need to be building up.
- We have a great group of employees and volunteers, really hard-working people. Each role is an important piece of the KCCA puzzle. Sometimes one role may overlap or seem to negatively impact another's. We must work together, not fight for turf, to resolve issues for the bigger KCCA win.
- We need to set KCCA up to succeed.


events around the metro area several times a year, singing at Christmas, Veterans Day and other seasonal events. Chapter quartets also perform numerous paid "Singing Valentines."

On June 14, 2022, the Board of Directors approved the following changes to the KCCA room rental fee policy:

- Member groups that are putting on events that are open to all KCCA members at no cost may now use a KCCA common room for up to four (4) hours without a fee.
- 2. An existing club that wants to reserve a different day, room, or time no longer needs to pay the going rate for that reservation.

For both #1 and #2, the
resident member that is
reserving the room must
complete a room rental form
and provide a security deposit
as described on the form.

The Clubs & Amenities committee recommended these changes to address some gray areas and pain points in our fee policy for KCCA common rooms. Here, then, is the updated policy:

Description	Cost
KCCA BOD meetings, sub-association meetings, and BOD committee meetings	No charge
Member clubs (after submission and approval of club registration form)	No charge
Member groups hosting events that are open to all KCCA members at no cost (after submission and approval of room rental form)	No charge
Private events (after submission and approval of room rental form)	Fee based on room and duration of event

Outdoor Pool Update

are using the pool but must be kept up at all times for everyone's safety - except during lap swimming as per the following

Oregon Health Authority, Oregon Administrative Rules Chapter 333 – Division 60 Public Swimming Pools, Section 333-060-0065 - Finishes, Markings and Lifelines:

"the lifeline shall lie in place except when pool use is restricted to lap swimming..."

If you take it down, please put it back. If, for some reason, someone forgot,



ning please be a good neighbor and kindly put it back for all our safety and ability to keep the pool open.
