and various small weights are provided for your use during class.

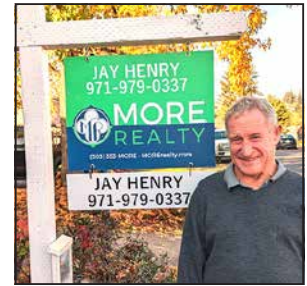

Developing Solutions for Change

As part of our ongoing Community Conversation series, on January 14, 2023, we held a discussion on Developing Solutions for Change with the idea that people can and should come together to talk about what matters to them, and work together to successfully change the community. The members focused this conversation primarily on strategies to increase communication and stabilize reserve funding.

Solutions included (not in any order):

Communication:

- Provide accurate information. Re-publish when incorrect.
- Perform amenity survey
- Hire an Administrator
- Post Community Conversation meetings on the website
- Provide hard copies of governing documents in the office and library for member viewing
- Provide access to KCCA website via public computer
- Provide PDF searchable governing document
- Publish member directory
- Post committee contacts
- Sandwich boards to announce

board meetings – option for members place in their yard

Reserves:

- Post monthly financial article in newsletter and on website
- Provide monthly reserve report (expenditures and transfer fees received), committed expenditures, revenue, vs bank balance as well as carry over deferred maintenance.
- Clearer descriptive GL codes for easy identification
- Produce a simple version of balance sheet and P&L
- Create a 3–5-year reserve financial plan
- Add reserve contingency in

budget to cover ‘surprises’

- Purchase maintenance/reserve tracking software providing the ability to track and manage reserve assets, maintenance, and funding.
- Provide cost/revenue associated with the amenities to understand and open future conversation about amenity viability.
- Discuss financial information in board meetings

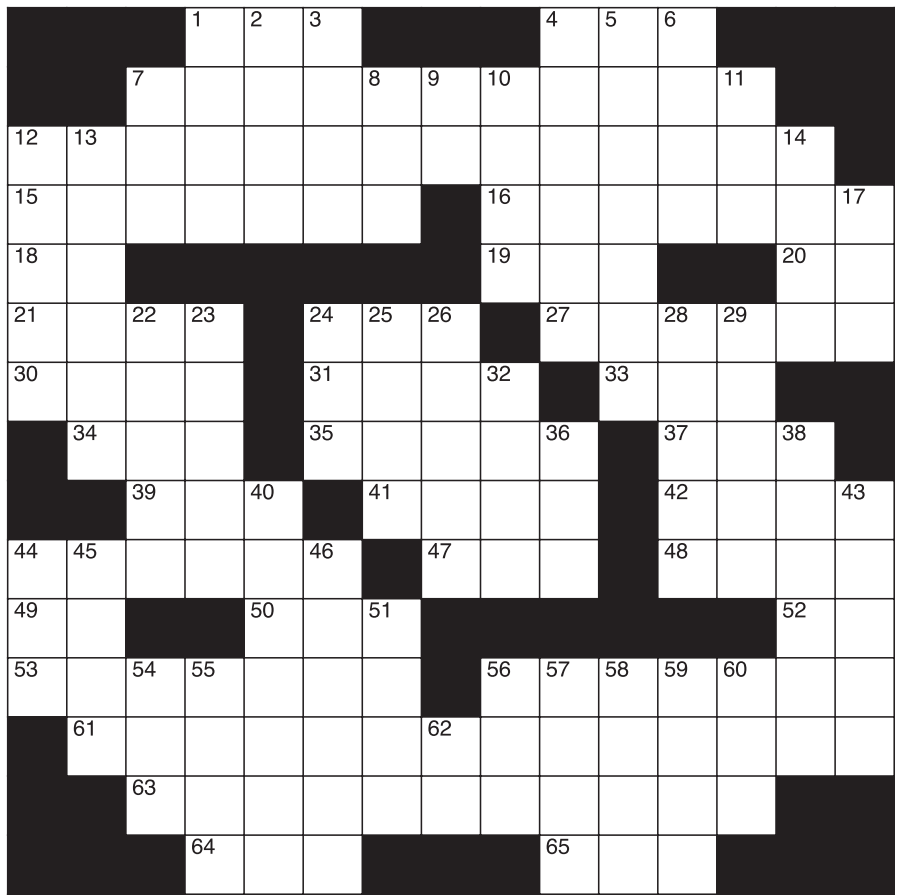
