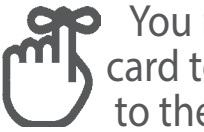

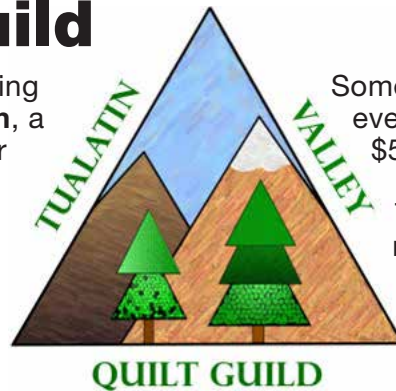


Tualatin Valley Quilt Guild

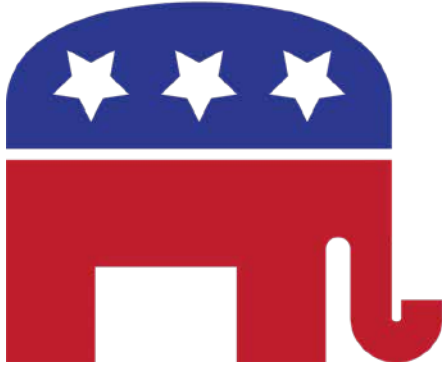

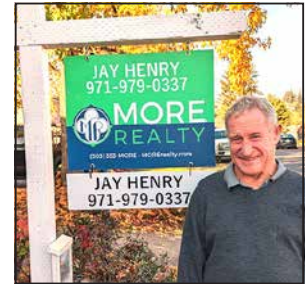
