2023 Election Review

This is the 5th year that we have combined electronic voting and paper ballots.

Our 20% turnout needs to improve. This is the one time when members can select directors so the board can function. We had a difficult time getting members to run for the board: Michelle Faber, with 195 votes, and "AJ" Simmons, with 161 votes and became our new board members at the June 13 board meeting. June 13 was the first board meeting after the election, and that is when newly elected directors took their seats on the board. We

had two write-in candidates for the board: Chris Walbridge 131 and Sherrye Steffens 112. Some write-ins had different spelling etc., and were listed separately. The Election Committee added the different spelling of names to the appropriate candidate's total. I would like to thank all the candidates for their hard work and dedication to the betterment of KCCA.

Some comments were received about changing the election schedule, and the new board will look at the schedule and refine it so that it meets our needs. Due to a hiccup, the database for the apartments was not received by YesElections and was mailed out late. As part of the changes, we will delay the closing date of

the election to provide sufficient time for the votes to be counted. To resolve this issue of voting lists not being received by YesElections, we will provide the total number of voters in the future, and YesElections will collaborate the number before mailing the ballots. We have two voting lists, Apartments provided by the apartment manager and the remainder of KCCA provided by our staff. The KCCA mailing list uses Member information to maintain accuracy. When there are changes to your household, the staff has to be made aware of these changes. Some people left two years ago, and the resident just notified the staff of the change this year. You must turn in your affidavit to the office every year so the office can maintain an accurate member list.

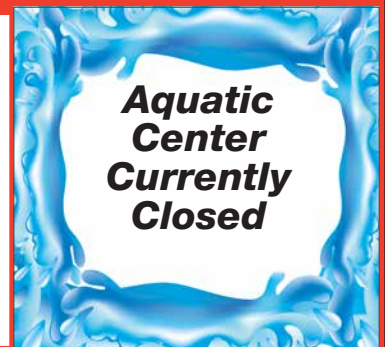

We would also like to let you know we have ordered Board approved signs for LARC-approved projects that you can simply place in your yard.

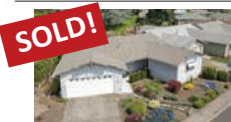

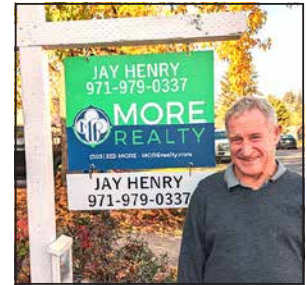

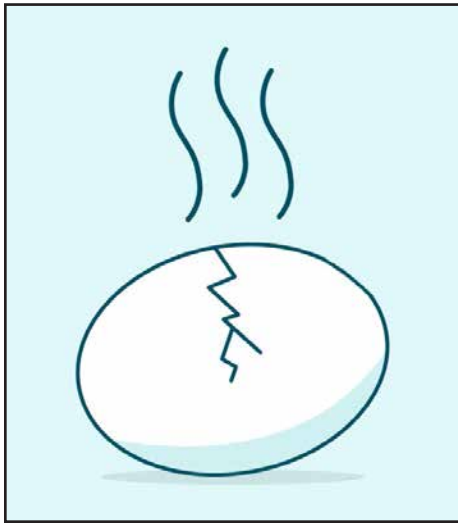
