COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Doraine Bault (Croquet): Croquet Club is doing well and players are preparing to play with improving weather. Due to the weather the regular group of club croquet players have not played much in April although a few die hard players braved the elements to get in a few games. Overall the lawn has survived the wet, cold winter pretty well allowing balls to roll true and fast. The lawn has suffered some minor winter damage to the North 20% and Jeff will be evaluating the best method to initiate repair to damaged areas. With club play scheduled to begin soon Lawn Bowling and Croquet club presidents will be consulting with Jeff regarding available times for lawn aeration, over seeding, sand application and rolling. USCA members are looking forward to returning in July for the USCA regional event when hopefully the weather will be a little warmer and drier.

Jeff Halfman (Golf Course Superintendent): All greens are in good health with minimal disease damage. Plugging/sanding may not be an option this Spring and fertilizer application is scheduled to begin in the next couple of weeks. Tees boxes and approaches have been sanded to help water more easily be absorbed into the soil and keep areas firm for play. Fairways are being mowed two times per week when weather permits although some areas on the course are a little soggy for mowing with the gang mower. Brian has cleaned all flower beds and due to his unfortunate injury planting of flowers this year is questionable. Irrigation pump is operational, sprinklers are in the process of being adjusted for maximum coverage and Number seven tee box grass is starting to fill in.

David Mack (Lawn Bowling): Currently evaluating condition of lawn Ditch boards and will be making recommendations to Jeff regarding possible repairs. Opening day for club play will be June 3rd and players are anxious for the season to begin.

Joy Olmstead (Pro Shop Manager): Revenue improved tremendously in April! We had quite a few warm, sunny days and our tee sheet book surely showed it. Pass sales are continuing to pick up. As always, it is a pleasure welcoming back the King City Ladies' and Men's Clubs as April was their season kick-off events. The Shriner's' tournament is scheduled for June and the Spark Golf group started play in April. Comments from all Spark players have been extremely positive and they are a fun group of people to play with each Thursday.
