KCCA Information Update:

Your Board and Committees at Work

Microphones and evaluation for sound system

On 12-27-23, OHM Systems (the company from which we originally purchased the microphones and complete sound system and installed all hardware) performed a sound system and evaluation of our wireless microphones. They found the Microphones were not set up correctly, some on the same frequency so they calibrated and set them all with different frequencies. Each was tested and one had a broken switch that could not be repaired. That one will be replaced. OHM Systems said the microphones are good quality and should last a long time, no new ones or upgrades are needed. Rob Peters, Jeff Halfman and Mark Ward were present, and Rob took photos of the individual microphone settings for reference. Jeff and I learned how to sync any new mics. At the same time, we tested the wired mics, and all 4 tested good. The rest of the system checked out good. Total cost was \$250.

■ Zoom

Mark Ward and Rob Peters moved forward at looking into Zoom systems; Melanie gathered up all components we had from the old system that was bought during the Pandemic. We have a dedicated laptop, a wide-angle camera, and an adjustable camera stand. The camera was connected to a laptop and tested, it is wide angle and can pick up the whole board. We will need to buy a Zoom USB multiple microphones system; this is a controller mixer and speakers, that connects to the laptop that will be the Zoom administrator. This is a cost of \$399.00 from Martel Electronics. The Finance and Budget Committee approved the cost for this on 01-02-24, and the Board approved the purchase on 01-09-24.

■ Zoom Webinar

The next part of this is to buy oneyear Zoom webinar package, the cost is \$690 a year The Zoom Webinar package that hosts up to 500 participants (KCCA Residents) will cost \$690 a year. The Finance and Budget Committee approved on 01-02-24, and the Board approved the purchase on 01-09-24. Our goal is to get Zoom up and running ASAP (with due diligence).

The 2024 budget has \$13,000 in it for Ring Central. We have decided not to move forward with it. Nexttech, our I.T. service, proposed Ring Central to KCCA to replace the Zultys phone system. After a review and presentation by Nexttech, we discovered we have a contract with our phone system Touch Point/Zultys for the next 20 months, and it would cost \$6,900 to buy out the contract. The Zultys contract auto-renewed after sending several emails to our office notifying us of the renewal and opt-out, but the office staff overlooked them. Ring Central is not a good fit for us, as we could not use it to half its potential, and we would need to budget again in another 5 to 6 years for upgrades. 90 days before this contract is up, we will reassess the Zultys phone system and see if we need to upgrade or switch service at that time.






