"We've got your sign—sign, sign everywhere, a sign—I couldn't fit that on a sign—should have read the detour sign."

There are a lot of projects going on in KCCA, such as house painting, landscaping, fencing, gates, solar panels, and more. If you are thinking about a project for the exterior of your home, you need to complete a LARC Project Request Form available on KCCA's website (tinvurl.com/5283t2se) or from the KCCA Office. This form asks for a project description, homeowner's name and contact information and if you have contacted your neighbors to advise them of the upcoming project. The form is submitted to the KCCA Office for review by the LARC Committee. The Committee may approve or deny the request based on LARC

rules. If a project is denied, a resident may appeal the denial to the KCCA Board.

Once a project is approved, LARC will deliver a signed Project Request Form to the resident along with a LARC Approved Project Sign. The project sign remains until project completion, when the homeowner then notifies LARC to retrieve it.

May I place a political or campaign sign in my yard?

Yes, you may. Please be advised that campaign/election signs may only be displayed for the sixty (60) days prior to an election. And they must be removed within seven (7) days after the election.

I'm having a garage sale. May I put up signs?

Yes, you may. Please also be advised that KCCA has a limit of two (2) signs per unit; each sign



may not exceed four (4) square feet in surface area and be no more than three (3) feet in height from the ground. Garage, estate, and open house signs may only be displayed for seventy-two (72) hours. The only other types of signs allowed are For Sale signs.

How To Contribute

Men's Golf News

This has been a very good month for golf at King City. Tuesday formats filled up very fast with the varied formats played, while our regular Thursdays garnered 65-70 players competing in several team formats. Our Fall Match Play tournament started with 32 players (the largest yet) and ended this week with **Mike Rodriguez** winning and **Richard Rodondi** as runner-up.

Some upcoming venues:

The Men's Club will participate in the Women's Charity Tournament on Sept. 18. The Fall Handicap Tournament will begin on Oct. 3, ending on Oct. 10. Open to King City Men's Golf Club members, both rounds will be 18 holes.

One rule that gives many players fits is how to apply Rule 19:

In golf, an unplayable ball refers to a situation where a player deems

their ball unplayable due to various reasons such as being in a difficult

lie, in a hazard, or in an obstruction. When faced with an unplayable ball, a player has several options under the Rules of Golf, including taking a penalty stroke and dropping the ball within certain parameters. It is important for players to understand and follow the rules regarding unplayable balls to ensure fair play and maintain the integrity of the game.

The difficult lie is the option that gives the most trouble:

In golf, if a player's ball is in a difficult lie where it is deemed unplayable, the player has the option to declare the ball unplayable and take a penalty stroke. The player then has three options for proceeding under Rule 19 of the Rules of Golf. They can go back to where they last played from, drop within two club lengths MEASURED FROM WHERE THE BALL LAY but no closer to the hole, or drop on a line from the hole through where the ball lay. It is important for players to assess the situation carefully and choose the option that best suits their circumstances while adhering to the rules of golf.

> Note: sometimes the two club lengths will not get you out from under the big evergreen tree, so you have to take one of the other two options.

I would like to recognize both Jeff Halfman and Miguel Jaqiz for over 20 years of service to the King City Golf Course. Both men came on board in 2013.


