Strength in readiness, safety in preparation

Important Documents

Having your important documents and information readily available in the event of a disaster can help you in starting the recovery process.

Documents should be quickly accessible in case an evacuation is necessary. Consider fire-proof storage and a waterproof 'go bag.' Alternately, copies can be stored on a password-protected flash drive or as a password-protected backup on a virtual cloud service.

Here is a partial list of documents for you to consider. Please refer to the resources listed below for more comprehensive suggestions.

- List of phone numbers, email, and address for family and personal business contacts.

- Photo ID, driver license, passport, immigration records, DD214.
- Insurance policy account and phone numbers for life, auto, home, flood, medical, etc.
- Will, Trust, Living Will, General and Medical POA.
- Bank and credit card account numbers.
- Safe-deposit box location and number.
- Current individual photos of household members as ID.
- Current household member group picture.
- Copies of important keys.
- List of website accounts and passwords.
- Household inventory with values and photos.
- Minimum of 5-days worth of cash in small bills.

Cash is a valuable resource in emergencies as it provides immediate access to essential goods and services like temporary lodging, food, water, fuel, and medical supplies.

During a natural disaster, power outages, or disruption in digital services, the role of cash is crucial. Banks and credit unions could be closed. ATM's and credit card systems may be down. Stores may need to conduct business on a 'cash only' basis, and having **small denominations of cash** will be to your advantage.

1) RVs, CAMPERS, UTILITY TRAILERS

– please remember HOA rules require rvs, campers, and utility trailers may be parked on your property or KCCA streets for a maximum of seventy-two (72) hours

2) SIGNS –there is a two (2) sign limit per property for: political/campaign, vendor, estate/garage sale, real estate and miscellaneous signs. Political signs may be displayed sixty (60) days prior to an election and must be removed seven (7) days after an election

3) PROJECTS – HOA rules require homeowners to complete a LARC Project Request Form (available at KCCA Office or on KCCA website) prior to the beginning of a project (exterior painting, roofing, landscaping, solar panels, etc.). LARC will review the request and notify the homeowner ASAP. An approved request form, along with a LARC sign, will be delivered to



the homeowner. Project signs should be placed in the yard at the start of the project. Please notify LARC: cmccollough@mykcca.com or mkmaney01@msn.com upon completion of the project for sign pick up. **Some projects may require both LARC approval and permitting by King City

4) SIDEWALKS & CURBS – each KCCA homeowner is responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of sidewalks and curbs adjacent to his/her property. Please trim the shrubbery along the sidewalk, weed along the sidewalk and curb, and weed between the curb and street. Overhanging shrubs and weeds are trip hazards

5) GARBAGE, RECYCLING AND YARD WASTE CANS/BINS – kindly place your cans/ bins on the street and not on the sidewalk adjacent to your property. Placement of cans and bins on the sidewalk blocks the sidewalks for our neighbors who enjoy walking around KCCA. Please be considerate of your neighbors as some have mobility issues. Changing paths to and from sidewalks and curbs is often difficult for people using walkers, canes and other devices.

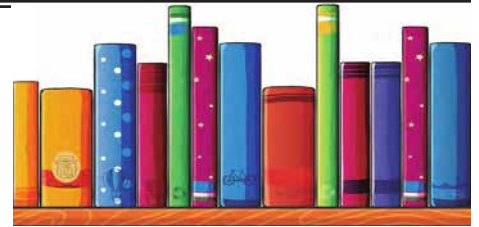

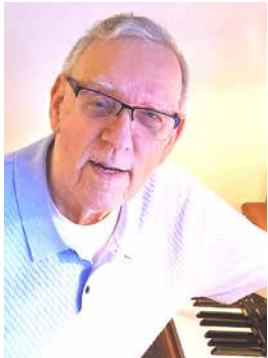
who complete the weekly scoring, to those who keep the club sponsors’ signs front and center. All play an important role in the KCWGC.

Ray Beyer is one of the directors of the King City Music Club Chorus.

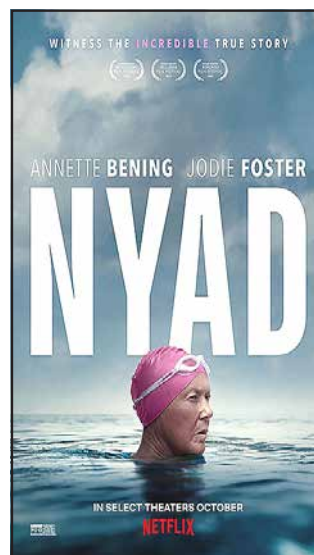
