LARC is a standing KCCA Board committee that reports to the KCCA Board of Directors. LARC reviews and processes landscape and architectural projects and change requests for residents' home exteriors.

- To ensure consistency with landscape, architectural design and community appearance
- To provide guidance on property maintenance and to apply consistent application of LARC rules
- To protect KCCA property values through uniform standards and rules






